| 13 | telephoned the Pharmacy with a prescription refill for her Vicodin prescription, pretending to be     |
| 14 | someone from her prescribing doctor's office. Respondent's co-worker, who took her call,              |
| 15 | recognized Respondent's voice. She contacted the prescribing doctor's office and was informed         |
| 16 | that the doctor's office had not called in a refill and in fact a refill had not yet been authorized. |
