2	3.	This Accusation is brought before the Board, Department of Consumer Affairs,	
3	under the a	authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and	
4	Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.		
5	4.	Code section 118(b), provides, in pertinent part, that the expiration of a license shall	
6	not deprive	e the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a disciplinary action during the period	
7	within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued, or reinstated.

9	5.	Norco is a brand of a compound consisting of hydrocodone and acetaminophen.	
10	Hydrocodo	one is a Schedule II controlled substance by California Health and Safety Code Section	
11	11055(b)(1)(I) and is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.

26	12.	Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Director may request			
27		rative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or			
28	violations of	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation			

and enforcement of the case.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

13. At all relevant times to the charges brought herein, Respondent was a Pharmacy 3 Technician employed at CVS Pharmacy #09814 located at 8101 Greenback Lane, Fair Oaks, 4 5 California. Beginning in or about December of 2011, Respondent began taking, converting, diverting, possessing, and ingesting Norco tablets consisting of 7.5 milligrams of hydrocodone 6 and 325 milligrams of acetaminophen (7.5/325). An audit of CVS pharmacy number 09814 7 revealed that between May of 2011 and April of 2013 Respondent converted, diverted, took, 8 stole, or otherwise took possession of 1,539 tablets without a valid or lawful prescription of the 9 dangerous drug and controlled substance Norco. Respondent's diversion, acquisition, possession 10 and ingestion of the 7.5/325 Norco included time while Respondent was in the course and scope 11 of her job duties and responsibilities as a pharmacy technician. 12

14. The CVS audit further revealed that between October of 2011 and June of 2013
Respondent diverted, took, stole, or otherwise took possession of 10,667 tablets of the dangerous
drug and controlled substance Norco comprised of 10 milligrams of hydrocodone and 325
milligrams of acetaminophen (10/325) without a valid or lawful prescription. Respondent's
conversion, diversion, acquisition, possession and ingestion of the 10/325 Norco included time
while Respondent was in the course and scope of her job duties and responsibilities as a
pharmacy technician.

15. During the relevant time, Respondent took, used or ingested Norco tablets, up to as
much as 10 to 12 tablets daily, and was under the influence of the dangerous drug Norco while in
the course and scope of her job duties and responsibilities as a pharmacy technician. Respondent
furnished a portion of the Norco to others without a lawful prescription including but not limited
to Respondent's father.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Corruption)

16. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct pursuant to section 4301(f) because Respondent while in the course and scope of her job duties and responsibilities as a pharmmacy technician took, stole, diverted and possessed the dangerous drug and controlled substance Norco. The circumstances are as follows:

17. Paragraphs 13 through 15 are incorporated herein as though set forth at length. Respondent took, diverted, stole and possessed at least one thousand five hundred (1,500) tablets of 7.5/325 Norco and at least five thousand (5,000) tablets of 10/325 Norco and up to as much as ten thousand five hundred (10,556) tablets of Norco. Respondent possessed the Norco without lawful authority to take or possess Norco while in the course and scope of her job duties and responsibilities as a pharmacy technician

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct-Self Administration/Dangerous Conduct)

18. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct pursuant to section 4301(h) because Respondent used a dangerous drug and controlled substance to an extent and in a manner that was dangerous to herself or others. The circumstances are as follows:

18 19. Paragraphs 13 through 15 are incorporated herein as though set forth at length. 19 Respondent admitted ingesting and using Norco while in the course and scope of her job duties 20 and responsibilities as a pharmacy technician to an extent and in a manner that was dangerous to herself an others. Respondent admitted to consuming up to 10 to 12 Norco tablets per day 21without a lawful prescription. By working in the pharmacy after ingesting Norco without a 22 prescription, Respondent demonstrated a lack of fitness and judgment to safely perform the 23 24 functions, duties and obligations of a pharmacy technician and constituted a danger to public 25 health, safety and welfare.

3	20. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct pursuant to
4	sections 4301(j) and 4060 in that Respondent violated statutes and laws regulating controlled
5	substances and dangerous drugs. The circumstances are as follows:
6	21. Paragraphs 13 and 15 are incorporated herein as though set forth at length.
7	Respondent's acts and conduct in converting, diverting, possessing and consuming Norco to the
8	extent and in the admitted amounts without a lawful prescription rendered Respondent unfit and
9	lacking the judgment necessary to perform the duties, obligations and functions of a pharmacy
10	technician.
11	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
12	(Unprofessional Conduct-Furnishing Controlled Substances)
13	22. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct pursuant to
14	sections 4301(j) and 4059 in that Respondent furnished a controlled substance to another without
15	a valid or lawful prescription. The circumstances are as follows:
16	23. Paragraphs 13 through 15 are incorporated herein as though set forth at length.
17	Respondent took, diverted, and stole then supplied Norco to her father without a valid or lawful
18	prescription.
19	<u>PRAYER</u>
20	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein
21	alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:
22	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician license No. TCH 42484, issued to
23	Jaime Lynn Scott;
24	2. Ordering Jamie Lynn Scott to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of
25	the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section
26	125.3; and
