21	2. On or about October 24, 2013, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy	
22	Technician Registration No. TCH 134933 to Ashlyn Nicole Hildebrandt (Respondent). The	
23	Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges	
24	brought herein and will expire on August 31, 2015, unless renewed.	
25	JURISDICTION	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following	
27	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated	
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- 4. Section 4060 provides in pertinent part, that no person shall possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or other authorized prescriber.
- 5. Section 4300 provides, in pertinent part, that every license issued by the Board is subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.
 - Section 4300.1 states: 6.

"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

Section 4301 states, in pertinent part:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any "(h) dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license.

The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United "(i) States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs."

COST RECOVERY

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8. Section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing ///

act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

- 9. "Alprazolam," is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d) and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.
- 10. "Heroin," is a Schedule I controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11054, subdivision (c)(11) and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.
- 11. "Hydrocodone," is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (b)(1)(I) and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.
- 12. "Lorazepam," is the generic name for Ativan. It is a Schedule IV controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11057, subdivision (d)(11) and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.
- 13. "Opiates," is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (b)(1) and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Obtained or Possessed a Controlled Substance)

14. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j), as defined in section 4060, in that on or about October 2, 2014, an officer observed a drug transaction between Respondent's boyfriend and another and both Respondent and her boyfriend entered a vehicle. During a search of Respondent's vehicle, the officer located a small quantity of Heroin from inside the vehicle console. The officer noticed that the bag containing the Heroin was the same bag he witnessed in the drug transaction. The officer also located one Alprazolam prescription pill bottle labeled with Respondent's name, containing Alprazolam pills and three bindles that contained a total of 0.66g of Heroin. In addition, the officer located an unmarked
