2. On or about December 19, 2008, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration				
Number TCH 79780 to Ignacio Camargo (Respondent). Said registration was in full force and				
effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on October 31, 2016,				
unless renewed				
3. On or about April 15, 2016, pursuant to a decision in the administrative proceeding				
entitled In the Matter of the Petition for Interim Suspension Order Against: Ignacio Camargo				
(Case No. 5712	?), Respondent's registration as	a pharmacy technician was suspended and he was		
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1	prohibited from engaging in any act or activity requiring licensure or registration as a pharmacy
2	technician pending the filing of the Accusation and issuance of a decision on the Accusation.
3	JURISDICTION AND STATUTORY PROVISIONS
4	4. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following
5	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise
6	indicated.
7	5. Section 4300 of the Code provides, in pertinent part:
8	"(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.
9 10	(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:
11	(1) Suspending judgment.
12	(2) Placing him or her upon probation.
13	(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one
14	year. (4) Revoking his or her license.
15	(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the
16	board in its discretion may deem proper.
17	(c) The board may refuse a license to any applicant guilty of unprofessional conduct. The board may, in its sole discretion, issue a probationary
18	license to any applicant for a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct and who has met all other requirements for licensure. The board may issue the license subject
19	to any terms or conditions not contrary to public policy, including, but not limited to, the following:
20	(1) Medical or psychiatric evaluation.
21	(2) Continuing medical or psychiatric treatment.
22	(3) Restriction of type or circumstances of practice.
23	(4) Continuing participation in a board-approved rehabilitation program.
24	(5) Abstention from the use of alcohol or drugs.
25	(6) Random fluid testing for alcohol or drugs.
26	(7) Compliance with laws and regulations governing the practice of
27	pharmacy.
28	(d) The board may initiate disciplinary proceedings to revoke or suspend
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1 2	any probationary certificate of licensure for any violation of the terms and conditions of probation. Upon satisfactory completion of probation, the board shall convert the probationary certificate to a regular certificate, free of conditions.
3	(e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the
4	Government Code, and the board shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of the action is subject to review by the
5	superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of Civil Procedure."
6	6. Section 4301 of the Code provides, in pertinent part:
7 8	"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:
9 10	
10	(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as
12	a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
13	
14	(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
15	7. Section 4060 of the Code provides, in pertinent part:
16 17	"A person shall not possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to
18	Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a
19 20	pharmacist pursuant to Section 4052.1, 4052.2, or 4052.6. This section does not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, third- party logistics provider pharmacy pharmacist physician podiatrist dentist
20	party logistics provider, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, if in stock in containers correctly labeled with the
22	name and address of the supplier or producer.
23	This section does not authorize a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own
24	stock of dangerous drugs and devices."
25	COST RECOVERY
26	8. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
27	administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
28	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
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enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement. FACTUAL BACKGROUND

9. In October 2015, Respondent was employed as a pharmacy technician at Walgreens
Pharmacy in Redlands, California (Walgreens). On or about October 12, 2015, the Walgreens
asset protection manager noticed a large amount of negative adjustments in the pharmacy's
prescription medication indicating a shortage (and possible theft) of hundreds of controlled
substance pills. On October 19, 2015, Respondent was observed selecting and concealing several
Hydrocodone¹ pills in his coat pocket. An investigation revealed that Respondent took
approximately 1,000 tablets of Hydrocodone and 50 tablets of Carisoprodol² from Walgreens.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unlawful Possession of a Controlled Substance and Dangerous Drug)

14 10. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4060 of the Code on the
15 grounds of unprofessional conduct in that Respondent unlawfully possessed a controlled
16 substance and a dangerous drug without the prescription of an authorized prescriber. The conduct
17 is described in more particularity in paragraph 9 above, inclusive and hereby incorporated by
18 reference.

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SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Act Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)

11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (f) of the Code on the grounds of unprofessional conduct in that Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, or deceit. The conduct is described in more particularity in paragraph 9 above, inclusive and hereby incorporated by reference.

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¹ Hydrocodone (Norco) is a Schedule II controlled substance pursuant to Health and Safety Code section 11055 and is categorized as a dangerous drug pursuant to section 4022 of the Code.

² Carisoprodol (Soma) is a dangerous drug pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4022.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

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(Violation of the Statutes Governing Dangerous Drugs)

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3	12. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (j) of the		
4	Code on the grounds of unprofessional conduct in that Respondent violated statutes governing		
5	dangerous drugs. Specifically, Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11173,		
. 6	subdivision (a), for unlawfully obtaining controlled substances by fraud, deceit,		
7	misrepresentation, or subterfuge, Health and Safety Code section 11350, for unlawfully		
8	possessing controlled substances without valid prescriptions, and section 4060 of the Code. The		
9	conduct is described in more particularity in paragraph 9 above, inclusive and hereby		
10	incorporated by reference.		
11	PRAYER		
12	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,		
13	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:		
14	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 79780,		
15	issued to Ignacio Camargo;		
16	2. Ordering Ignacio Camargo to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the		
17	investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section		
18	125.3;		
19	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
