| 21 | 1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official |
| 22 | capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer |
| 23 | Affairs. |
| 24 | 2. On July 17, 2013, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration Number |
| 25 | TCH 132929 to Sadie Michelle Walker (Respondent). The Pharmacy Technician Registration |
| 26 | was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein, and will expire on |
| 27 | May 31, 2017, unless renewed. |

- 10. Health & Safety Code section 11550 states, in pertinent part:
- (a) A person shall not use, or be under the influence of any controlled substance that is (1) specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), (21), (22), or (23) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in paragraph (1) or (2) of subdivision (d) or in paragraph (3) of subdivision (e) of Section 11055, or (2) a narcotic drug classified in Schedule III, IV, or V, except when administered by or under the direction of a person licensed by the state to dispense, prescribe, or administer controlled substances. It shall be the burden of the defense to show that it comes within the exception. A person convicted of violating this subdivision is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to serve a term of not more than one year in a county jail. The court may also place a person convicted under this subdivision on probation for a period not to exceed five years.

COST RECOVERY

11. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

DRUGS

- 12. Amphetamine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d)(1), and categorized as a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.
- 13. Methamphetamine is a Schedule II controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11055, subdivision (d)(2), and categorized as a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Self-Administration of Controlled Substances Without Prescription)

14. Respondent has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivision (h) in that she self-administered the controlled substances, amphetamine and methamphetamine, without prescription. The circumstances are as follows:

| a. At or about 1:00 in the morning on January 15, 2016, officers from the |

| Costa Mesa Police Department responded to a noise complaint. When they arrived at the |
| apartment, Respondent appeared to be under the influence of drugs. The officers observed |
| Respondent's rapid speech, large pupils, absence of horizontal and vertical gaze nystagmuses, |
| and lack of convergence. Respondent admitted to having been up for the past three days using |
| methamphetamine. Respondent also admitted to smoking marijuana and taking approximately .5 |
| to 1 gram of Xanax. Respondent failed the under the influence of a combination of central |
| nervous system (CNS) stimulants and CNS depressants examination and was arrested for being |
| under the influence of drugs. Respondent was transported to the jail for booking and processing. |
| On February 24, 2016, Respondent's toxicological examination report indicated positive for |
| amphetamine and methamphetamine. |

b. On January 25, 2016, in a criminal proceeding entitled *The People of the State of California vs. Sadie Michelle Walker*, in Orange County Superior Court, West Justice Center, Case Number 16WM01136, Respondent was charged with violation of HSC section 11550, subdivision (a), use and under the influence of controlled substance methamphetamine, a misdemeanor. On April 21, 2016, Respondent completed the Defense Drug Dismissal Program. On June 20, 2016, the motion of the People for terminal disposition was granted, the charge was dismissed, and the case closed.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of Pharmacy Law Regulating Controlled Substances and Dangerous Drugs)

15. Respondent has subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration to discipline under Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o) in that Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11550, subdivision (a), a pharmacy law of the State of California regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs, as detailed in paragraph 14, above, and incorporated herein by this reference.
