19	1. Virginia Herold ("Complainant") brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity	
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.	
21	2. On or about March 22, 1984, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License	
22	Number RPH 38375 to Eric Stafford Johnson ("Respondent"). The Pharmacist License was in ful	
23	force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on September	
24	30, 2017, unless renewed.	
25	<u>JURISDICTION</u>	
26	3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy ("Board"), Department of	
27	Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the	
28	Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise indicated.	
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1	4. Code section 4083 states, in pertinent part:	
2	(a) An inspector may issue an order of correction to a licensee directing the licensee to comply with this chapter or regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter.	
3 4	(f) Nothing in this section shall in any way limit the board's authority or ability to do any of the following:	
5	(3) Institute disciplinary proceedings pursuant to Article 19 (commencing with Section 4300).	
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7	5. Code section 4300 states, in pertinent part:	
8	(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.	
9 10	(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:	
11	(1) Suspending judgment.	
12	(2) Placing him or her upon probation.	
13	(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.	
14	(4) Revoking his or her license.	
15	(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its discretion may deem proper.	
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17	6. Code section 4300.1 states:	
18	The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement	
19	of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.	
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22	STATUTORY PROVISIONS	
23	7. Code section 4301 states, in pertinent part:	
24	The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of	
25	unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:	
26	(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit,	
27	or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.	
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13. Promethazine with codeine is a Schedule V controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11058(c)(1) and a dangerous drug pursuant to Code section 4022. Promethazine with codeine syrup is used to treat cough.

#### FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

# (Self Administration of Controlled Substance and Dangerous Drug)

14. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301, subdivision (h), in that on or about and between May 1, 2015, and January 8, 2016, Respondent self-administered lorazepam and promethazine with codeine, both controlled substances and dangerous drugs, to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to himself or others in that Respondent did not have a prescription for lorazepam and promethazine with codeine. Respondent admitted to a Board investigator that he took lorazepam and promethazine with codeine from his place of employment for personal use and used the controlled substances.

#### SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

# (Violating Laws Regulating Controlled Substances and Dangerous Drugs)

- 15. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301, subdivision (j), in that on or about and between May 1, 2015, and January 8, 2016, Respondent violated California laws regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs as follows:
- a. Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11170, in that Respondent self-administered lorazepam and promethazine with codeine, controlled substances, as set forth in paragraph 14, above.
- b. Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11171, in that Respondent unlawfully possessed lorazepam and promethazine with codeine, controlled substances, without a valid prescription, as set forth in paragraph 14, above.
- c. Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11173, subdivision (a), in that Respondent obtained lorazepam and promethazine with codeine, controlled substances, by fraud, deceit, or subterfuge, as set forth in paragraph 14, above.

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#### THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

# (Commission of Acts Involving Fraud or Deceit)

16. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301, subdivision (f), in that on or about and between May 1, 2015, and January 8, 2016, Respondent committed acts involving fraud or deceit when Respondent stole lorazepam and promethazine with codeine from his place of employment while he was working as a pharmacist.

# FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

# (Violating Laws Governing Pharmacy)

17. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301, subdivision (o), in that Respondent violated terms or provisions of the Pharmacy Law, as set forth above in paragraphs 14 through 16, above.

#### **PRAYER**

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 38375, issued to Eric Stafford Johnson;
- 2. Ordering Eric Stafford Johnson to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,
  - 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
