Original Pharmacy Permit

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2	2. On or about April 24, 2013, the Board issued Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 51210
3	to Tom Thanh Nguyen ("Respondent") as the Individual Licensed Owner and Pharmacist-In-
4	Charge ("PIC") doing business as Sunset Pharmacy. The Pharmacy Permit ("pharmacy permit")
5	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein, expired on April 1,
6	2015, and was cancelled on October 11, 2016.
7	Original Pharmacist License
8	3. On or about October 5, 2011, the Board issued Pharmacist License
9	Number RPH 66162 to Tom Thanh Nguyen ("Respondent"). The Pharmacist License
10	("pharmacist license") was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought
11	herein and will expire on November 30, 2018, unless renewed.
12	JURISDICTION
13	4. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following
14	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise
15	indicated.
16	5. Code section 4300 states, in pertinent part:
17	(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.
18 19	(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:
20	(1) Suspending judgment.
21	(2) Placing him or her upon probation.
22	(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.
23	(4) Revoking his or her license.
24	(5) Taking any other action in relation to disciplining him or her as the board in its discretion may down proper

26	6. Code section 4300.1 states:

7	to inspection by authorized officers of the law, and shall be preserved for at least three years from the date of making. A current inventory shall be kept by every
8	manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, veterinary food-animal drug retailer, physician, dentist, podiatrist, veterinarian, laboratory, clinic, hospital, institution, or
9	establishment holding a currently valid and unrevoked certificate, license, permit, registration, or exemption under Division 2 (commencing with Section 1200) of the Health and Safety Code or under Part 4 (commencing with Section 16000) of
0	Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code who maintains a stock of dangerous drugs or dangerous devices.
1	(b) The owner, officer, and partner of any pharmacy, wholesaler, or veterinary food-animal drug retailer shall be jointly responsible, with the pharmacist-in-charge
3	or representative-in-charge, for maintaining the records and inventory described in this section
4	8. Code section 4113, subdivision (c), states that "It like pharmacist-in-charge shall be
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5	responsible for a pharmacy's compliance with all state and federal laws and regulations pertaining
	to the practice of pharmacy."
7	9. Code section 4301 states, in pertinent part:

under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer. 1 director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or association whose application for a license has 2 been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, 3 4 associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, 5 suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other 6 position with management or control of a licensee as follows: 7 (1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five 8 vears. 9 (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated. 10 11. Code section 4333 states, in pertinent part, that all prescriptions filled by a pharmacy 11 and all other records required by Section 4081 shall be maintained on the premises and available 12 13 for inspection by authorized officers of the law for a period of at least three years. In cases where the pharmacy discontinues business, these records shall be maintained in a board-licensed facility 14 for at least three years. 15 16 12. Health and Safety Code section 11165, subdivision (d) states: 17 For each prescription for a Schedule II, Schedule III, or Schedule IV controlled substance, as defined in the controlled substances schedules in federal law and 18 regulations, specifically Sections 1308.12, 1308.13, and 1308.14, respectively, of Title 21 of the Code of Federal Regulations, the dispensing pharmacy, clinic, or other 19 dispenser shall report the following information to the Department of Justice as soon as reasonably possible, but not more than seven days after the date a controlled 20 substance is dispensed, in a format specified by the Department of Justice: 21 (1) Full name, address, and, if available, telephone number of the ultimate user or research subject, or contact information as determined by the Secretary of the 22 United States Department of Health and Human Services, and the gender, and date of birth of the ultimate user. 23 (2) The prescriber's category of licensure, license number, national provider 24 identifier (NPI) number, if applicable, the federal controlled substance registration number, and the state medical license number of any prescriber using the federal 25 controlled substance registration number of a government-exempt facility. 26 (3) Pharmacy prescription number, license number, NPI number, and federal controlled substance registration number. 27(4) National Drug Code (NDC) number of the controlled substance dispensed. 28 4

(5) Quantity of the controlled substance dispensed.
(6) International Statistical Classification of Diseases, 9th revision (ICD-9) or 10th revision (ICD-10) Code, if available.
(7) Number of refills ordered.
(8) Whether the drug was dispensed as a refill of a prescription or as a first-time
request.
(9) Date of origin of the prescription.
(10) Date of dispensing of the prescription.
13. California Code of Regulations ("CCR"), title 16, section 1704 states:
Each person holding a certificate, license, permit, registration or exemption to practice or engage in any activity in the State of California under any and all laws
administered by the Board shall file a proper and current residence address with the Board at its office in Sacramento and shall within 30 days notify the Board at its said
office of any and all changes of residence address, giving both the old and new address.
14. CCR, title 16, section 1708.2 states:
Any permit holder shall contact the board prior to transferring or selling any dangerous drugs, devices or hypodermics inventory as a result of termination of business or bankruptcy proceedings and shall follow official instructions given by the
board applicable to the transaction.
15. CCR, title 16, section 1715.6 states "[t]he owner shall report to the Board within
thirty (30) days of discovery of any loss of the controlled substances, including their amounts and
strengths."
16. CCR, title 16, section 1714, subdivision (b) states:
Each pharmacy licensed by the board shall maintain its facilities, space, fixtures, and equipment so that drugs are safely and properly prepared, maintained, secured and distributed. The pharmacy shall be of sufficient size and unobstructed
area to accommodate the safe practice of pharmacy.
17. CCR, title 16, section 1718 states:
"Current Inventory" as used in Sections 4081 and 4332 of the Business and Professions Code shall be considered to include complete accountability for all dangerous drugs handled by every licensee enumerated in Sections 4081 and 4332.
The controlled substances inventories required by Title 21, CFR, Section 1304 shall be available for inspection upon request for at least 3 years after the date of the inventory.
5
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COST RECOVERY 1 18. Code section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the 2 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of 3 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and 4 enforcement of the case. 5 BACKGROUND 6 19. On or about April 8, 2016, the Board received a complaint from C.T. alleging the 7 following: Respondent scammed C.T. into loaning him \$100,000 to open pharmacy stores in 8 9 California and Nevada; Respondent staged two burglaries in order to sell controlled substances to Vietnam; and Respondent informed C.T. that he had multiple investors to assist with selling drugs 10 to and from the United States, Vietnam, Laos and Cambodia. 11 On or about April 14, 2016, the Board opened an investigation into the allegations 20. 12 made by C.T. 13 **INSPECTION OF MAY 4, 2012 / BOARD INVESTIGATION** 14 21. On or about May 4, 2016, Board Inspectors P.P. and J.H. went to Sunset Pharmacy 15 located at 3101 Sunsent Boulevard, Suite 4C in Rocklin, California. Upon arrival, the inspectors 16 realized another business, Sunshine Nails, was in the location where Sunset Pharmacy was 17 supposed to be located. The inspectors entered Sunshine Nails and spoke with an employee who 18 stated Sunset Pharmacy had been out of business for approximately one (1) year. 19 On or about May 4, 2016, Board Inspector J.H. contacted the Board to determine 22. 20 whether Respondent submitted a Discontinuance of Business ("DOB") and the Board confirmed 21they have no such record of Sunset Pharmacy closing. 22 23. On or about May 10, 2016, Board Inspector J.H. requested from the Board the 23 CURES report and compliance report for Sunset Pharmacy. No CURES data was located by the 24 Board for Sunset Pharmacy during the time it was open for business, April 24, 2013 through 25 December 23, 2014. 26 On or about May 10, 2016, Board Inspector J.H. received a telephone call from 2724. 28 Respondent admitting that Sunset Pharmacy closed on December 23, 2014; Respondent placed all 6

remaining drugs in his inventory, including controlled substances and records, in a storage unit in Rocklin, California; and Respondent did not have enough time to look for other options because he "had a plane to catch in Asia;"

25. On or about May 18, 2016, Respondent submitted his DOB form to Board 4 Inspector J.H. via email indicating his business closed on December 23, 2014. Respondent's 5 DOB submission was two years and 116 days past due. The DOB stated that all records were 6 stored at Rocklin Storage in Rocklin, California. Respondent listed his address on the DOB as 7 8760 Center Parkway, #241 in Elk Grove, California rather than the address of record with the 8 9 Board of his P.O. Box or physical address of 6284 Lone Tree Boulevard in Rocklin, California. In his email, Respondent admitted that he did not have a list of inventory for the drugs stored in 10 storage unit. 11

12 26. On or about November 28, 2013, Respondent made a report to the Rocklin Police
13 Department of a burglary at Sunset Pharmacy where the following drugs were reported as taken:
14 five (5) bottles of promethazine with codeine and four (4) bottles of promethazine DM.

27. On or about July 4, 2014, Respondent made a report to the Rocklin Police
Department of a burglary at Sunset Pharmacy where the it was reported that a couple of bottles of
promethazine with codeine were taken.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Report Controlled Substances to CURES)

28. Respondent's pharmacy permit and pharmacist's license are subject to disciplinary
action under to Code section 4301, subdivision (j) and (o), on the grounds of unprofessional
conduct, in that Respondent violated Health and Safety Code section 11165, subdivision (d) as
follows: Respondent failed to report to CURES¹ any Schedule II, III, and IV controlled
substances dispensed during the time Sunset Pharmacy was open for business (April 24, 2013
through December 23, 2014).

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¹ CURES is California's Prescription Drug Monitoring Program for controlled substances. The program requires weekly reporting of all Schedule $\Pi - IV$ controlled substances.

1	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
2	(Failure to Maintain a Facility to Safely Store Drugs)	
3	29. Respondent's pharmacy permit and pharmacist's license are subject to disciplinary	
4	action under Code sections 4301, subdivision (0), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in	
5	that Respondent violated CCR, title 16, section 1714(b), in that Respondent failed to comply with	
6	the requirements to maintain a facility, space, fixtures, and equipment so that drugs are safely and	
7	properly secured as more particularly set forth above in paragraphs 24 and 25.	
8	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
9	(Discontinuance of Business and Maintenance of Records)	
10	30. Respondent's pharmacy permit and pharmacist's license are subject to disciplinary	
11	action under Code sections 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o), on the grounds of unprofessional	
12	conduct, in that Respondent violated CCR, title 16, section 1708.2 as it relates to Code	
13	sections 4081, subdivision (a) and 4333, subdivision (a), in that Respondent failed to comply with	
14	the requirements for discontinuance of a business and maintenance of the records, as more	
15	particularly set forth above in paragraphs 24 and 25.	
16	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
17	(Failure to Report Drug Loss)	
18	31. Respondent's pharmacy permit and pharmacist's license are subject to disciplinary	
19	action under to Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o) on the grounds of unprofessional	
20	conduct in that Respondent violated CCR, title 16, section 1715.6, by failing to report to the	
21	Board the burglary or theft of controlled substances from Sunset Pharmacy on November	
22	28, 2013, and July 4, 2014, as more particularly set forth above in paragraphs 26 and 27.	
23	FIFTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE	
24	(Failure to Notify of Change of Address)	
25	32. Respondent's pharmacist's license is subject to disciplinary action under Code	
26	section 4301, subdivision (0), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct in that Respondent	
27	violated CCR, title 16, section 1704 by failing to notify the Board of any and all changes of	
28	residence address within 30 days, as more particularly set forth above in paragraph 25.

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1	OTHER MATTERS
2	33. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number
3	PHY 51210 issued to Sunset Pharmacy, with Tom Thanh Nguyen as the Individual Licensed
.4	Owner and PIC, Sunset Pharmacy, with Tom Thanh Nguyen as the Individual Licensed Owner
5	and PIC shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer,
. 6	director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 51210
7	is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 51210 is reinstated if it is revoked.
8	34. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacist License
9	Number RPH 66162 issued to Tom Thanh Nguyen, while Tom Thanh Nguyen has been an officer
10	and owner and had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license
11	was disciplined, Tom Thanh Nguyen shall be prohibited from serving as a manager,
12	administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if
13	Pharmacist License Number PHY 66162 is placed on probation or until Pharmacist License
14	Number PHY 66162 is reinstated if it is revoked.
15	PRAYER
16	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,
17	and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:
18	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 66162, issued to Tom
19	Thanh Nguyen;
20	2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy License Number PHY 51210, issued to Tom
21	Thanh Nguyen doing business as Sunset Pharmacy;
22	3. Prohibiting Tom Thanh Nguyen from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
23	member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit
24	Number PHY 51210 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 51210 is
25	reinstated if it is revoked;
26	4. Prohibiting Tom Thanh Nguyen from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
27	member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacist License
