22	1. Complainant brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive	
23	Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs ("Board").	
. 24	2. On or about January 18, 2012, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician License	
25	Number TCH 117345 to Maureen Shavaughn Hornyak, also known as Maureen S. Khan, also	
26	known as Maureen Shavaughn Finley ("Respondent"). The Pharmacy Technician License was in	
27	full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on	
28	December 31, 2017, unless renewed.	
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		MAUREEN SHAVAUGHN HORNYAK) ACCUSATION

3. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

4. Section 4300, subdivision (a) of the Code states in pertinent part:

- (a) [e]very license issued may be suspended or revoked.
- (e) The proceedings under this article shall be conducted in accordance with Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code, and the board shall have all the powers granted therein. The action shall be final, except that the propriety of the action is subject to review by the superior court pursuant to Section 1094.5 of the Code of Civil Procedure.

5. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:

The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

STATUTES AND REGULATIONS

6. Section 4301 of the Code states in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

- (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.
- 7. Section 4060 of the Code states:

A person shall not possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to Section 4052.1, 4052.2, or 4052.6. This section does not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, third-party logistics provider, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse

and the center console area. The officer removed Respondent from the vehicle and searched the

vehicle. During that search, the officer located a clear sandwich bag in between Respondent's

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seat and the center console. The sandwich bag contained what appeared to be methamphetamine crystals. There were also what appeared to be methamphetamine crystals on Respondent's seat in the vehicle, and in Respondent's wallet which was sitting on the front seat of the vehicle with Respondent's identification in it. After booking, the officer tested and weighed the suspected methamphetamine crystals, which tested presumptive positive for methamphetamine. The methamphetamine located in Respondent's wallet weighed .18 grams, net, and the methamphetamine in the sandwich bag weighed 11.83 grams, net.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License Number TCH 117345, issued to Maureen Shavaughn Hornyak, aka Maureen S. Khan, aka Maureen Shavaughn Finley;
- 2. Ordering Maureen Shavaughn Hornyak, aka Maureen S. Khan, aka Maureen Shavaughn Finley to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,
 - Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
