19	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Statement of Issues solely in

22	2. On or about January 4, 2008, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) received an	
23	application for a Pharmacy Technician License from Hussein Darwish (Respondent). On or	
24	about December 31, 2007, Respondent certified under penalty of perjury to the truthfulness of al	
25	statements, answers, and representations in the application. The Board denied the application on	
26	June 3, 2008.	
27	<u>JURISDICTION</u>	
28	3. This Statement of Issues is brought before the Board under the authority of	

unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

## **CAUSE FOR DENIAL OF APPLICATION**

## (Unprofessional Conduct)

8. Respondent's application is subject to denial under sections 4301, subdivision (f) and 480, subdivision (a)(2), of the Code, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent committed acts which constitute unprofessional conduct when he submitted a false application for La Botica #1, that did not indicate the true owner of the pharmacy and misrepresented that he was related to the prior owner on his credit application. In addition, the lease agreement submitted to the Board had been altered, to indicate the prior owner was the true owner of La Botica #1.

## AGGRAVATING CIRCUMSTANCES

- 9. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent, Complainant further alleges by way of aggravation that Respondent's pharmacy technician license no. 25044 and original pharmacy permit no. 42084 was disciplined by the Board following the filing of an accusation in 2000 as follows:
- a. On or about October 27, 1999, Second Amended and First Supplemental Accusation No. 2098 was filed against Respondent. On or about May 6, 2000, Respondent signed a Stipulation in Settlement Decision and Order in Case No. 2098. On or about August 22, 2000, the Board adopted the Stipulation and Order, and the Board's Decision and Order became effective on or about September 21, 2000. Pursuant to the terms of the Decision and Order adopted by the Board, Respondent surrendered the original Pharmacy Permit no. 42084, and the Pharmacy Technician license no. 24271 was revoked. However, said revocation was stayed and Respondent was placed on probation for three (3) years. The circumstances surrounding the disciplinary action are that Respondent submitted a false application for La Botica #1, that did not indicate the true owner of the pharmacy and misrepresented that he was related to the prior owner on his credit application. In addition, the lease agreement submitted to the Board had been altered, to indicate the prior owner was the true owner of La Botica #1.

## PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board issue a decision:

Denying the application of Respondent for a Pharmacy Technician
 License, and

2. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
