24	(Respondent). On or about March 15, 2011, Respondent certified under penalty of perjury to the			
25	truthfulness of all statements, answers, and represer	tations in the application. The Board denied		
26	the application on March 8, 2012.			
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		STATEMENT OF ISSUES		

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1	JURISDICTION	
2	3.	This Accusation is brought before the Board and Department under the authority of the
3		wing laws. All sections references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise
4	indicated.	
5	STATUTORY PROVISIONS	
6	4.	Section 475 states, in pertinent part:
7		(a) Notwithstanding any other provisions of this code, the provisions of this division shall govern the denial of licenses on the grounds of:
8 9		(1) Knowingly making a false statement of material fact, or knowingly omitting the state of a material fact, in an application for a license.
0	5.	Section 480 states, in pertinent part:
1		(a) A board may deny a license regulated by this code on the grounds that the applicant has one of the following:
3		(1) Been convicted of a crime. A conviction within the meaning of this section means a plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere. Any action that a board is permitted to take following the establishment
4		of a conviction may be taken when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal, or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under the provisions of Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code.
.6 .7		(2) Done any act involving dishonesty, fraud or deceit with the intent to substantially benefit himself or herself or another, or substantially injure another;
8		3) (A) Done any act that if done by a licentiate of the business or profession in question, would be grounds for suspension or revocation of license.
20		(B) The board may deny a license pursuant of this subdivision only if the crime or act is substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession fro which application is made.

2		denied a license solely on the basis that he or she has been convicted of a felony if he

.6	6.	Section 4301 states in relevant part, that:
27		The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is
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1 not limited to, any of the following: 2 3 (f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as 4 a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not. 5 (g) Knowingly making or signing any certificate or other document that falsely represents the existence or nonexistence of a state of facts. 6 . . . . 7 (1) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, 8 functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. .... In all other cases, the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction 9 occurred. ..... A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this provision. The 10 board may take action ..., when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under Section 1203.4 of the 11 Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, 12 information, or indictment. 13 14 FIRST CAUSE FOR DENIAL 15 (Conviction of Crime) 16 17 7. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Code sections 480(a)(1). 18 480(a)(3)(A) and 4301(I), on the grounds Respondent was convicted of crimes that are 19 substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a pharmacy technician, as 20 follows: 21 8. On or about February 11, 2008, in a criminal proceeding in the Superior Court of 22 California, County of Fresno Central Division, Case Number F07909167, Respondent was 23 convicted by his plea of nolo contendere to one count of violating Penal Code Sections 664/459/ 24 460(b), a felony. The circumstances of the crime are that on or about December 1, 2007, 25 Respondent attempted to unlawfully enter a 76 gas station while armed with a semi-automatic 26 handgun. 27 9. On or about January 22, 2007, in a criminal proceeding in the Superior Court of 28 California, County of Fresno Central Division, Case Number F06909961, Respondent was 3

convicted by his plea of nolo contendere of one count of violation of Penal Code Section 459/ 1 2 460(b) (2nd degree burglary), a misdemeanor. The circumstances of the crime are that on or about and between December 15 and December 20, 2006, Respondent forged the name of Derrick 3 4 McElveen on a fraudulent check written for the amount of \$4,950.0, on a Wells Fargo checking account application. Respondent attempted to withdraw the full amount but was only permitted 5 to withdraw one hundred dollars until the fraudulent check cleared. Respondent was arrested 6 while attempting to withdrawal money from the account. 7 SECOND CAUSE FOR DENIAL 8 (Making False Statements) 9 10. Respondent's application is subject to denial under Code section 475(a) (1), and 10 Section 480(a)(3)(A) Section 4301(g) because Respondent failed to disclose two criminal 11 convictions in his application. The application for Pharmacy Technician license has a specific 12 question about past criminal convictions. On or about March 15, 2011, Respondent signed his 13 application under penalty of perjury and denied he had been convicted of crime. The true facts 14 are Respondent had two prior convictions, as set forth in paragraphs 8 and 9. 15 THIRD CAUSE FOR DENIAL 16 (Act Involving Moral Turpitude) 17 11. Paragraphs 8 through 10 are incorporated herein as though set forth at length. 18 Respondent's application is subject to denial under Code sections 480(a)(2), 480(a)(3)(A) and 19 4301(f) because Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, 20 21 or corruption, as set forth in paragraphs 8, 9, and 10. 22 <u>PRAYER</u> WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and 23 that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: 24 1. Denying the application of Simon Gebremichael, also known as Simon Berhe 25 Gebremicael, for an Pharmacy Technician Registration and, 26 27 111 111 28 4
