**DECISION AND ORDER**


The attached Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is hereby adopted by the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, as its Decision in this matter.

**STIPULATED SURRENDER OF**  
**LICENSE AND ORDER**

16 Respondent.

17 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties in this  
18 proceeding that the following matters are true:

19 PARTIES

20 1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy.  
21 She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by Kamala  
22 D. Harris, Attorney General of the State of California, by Char Sachson, Deputy Attorney  
23 General.

24 2. Cooper Joseph Winters (Respondent) is representing himself in this proceeding and  
25 has chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.

26 3. On or about April 20, 2010, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician  
27 Registration No. TCH 100859 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full  
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1 force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 3975 and will  
2 expire on April 30, 2012, unless renewed.

3 JURISDICTION

4 4. Accusation No. 3975 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of  
5 Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other  
6 statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on June 1, 2011. Respondent  
7 timely filed his Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 3975 is  
8 attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

9 ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

10 5. Respondent has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in  
11 Accusation No. 3975. Respondent also has carefully read, and understands the effects of this  
12 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

13 6. Respondent is fully aware of his legal rights in this matter, including the right to a  
14 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at  
15 his own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against him; the right to  
16 present evidence and to testify on his own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel  
17 the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and  
18 court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California  
19 Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

20 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and  
21 every right set forth above.

22 CULPABILITY

23 8. Respondent admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation  
24 No. 3975, agrees that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders his Pharmacy Technician  
25 Registration No. TCH 100859 for the Board's formal acceptance.

26 9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation he enables the Board to issue  
27 an order accepting the surrender of his Pharmacy Technician Registration without further process.

CONTINGENCY

2       10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent  
3 understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may  
4 communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or  
5 participation by Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that  
6 he may not withdraw his agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board  
7 considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order,  
8 the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this  
9 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not  
10 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

11       11. The parties understand and agree that facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of  
12 License and Order, including facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as  
13 the originals.

14       12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an  
15 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.  
16 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,  
17 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order  
18 may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing  
19 executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

20       13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that  
21 the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

23       IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 100859,  
24 issued to Respondent Cooper Joseph Winters, is surrendered and accepted by the Board of  
25 Pharmacy.

26       1. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance  
27 of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against  
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1 Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of  
2 Respondent's license history with the Board of Pharmacy.

3 2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy technician in California  
4 as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

5 3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was  
6 issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

7 4. If Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in  
8 the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent  
9 must meet licensure requirements current at the time of application. All of the charges and  
10 allegations contained in Accusation No. 3975 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by  
11 Respondent when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application for licensure.

12 5. Respondent shall not be eligible to apply for a new license until three years from the  
13 effective date of this Stipulated Surrender.

14 6. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the  
15 amount of \$1,357.00 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

16 7. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or  
17 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of  
18 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 3975 shall be deemed  
19 to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any  
20 other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

21 ACCEPTANCE

22 I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the  
23 stipulation and the effect it will have on my Pharmacy Technician Registration. I enter into this  
24 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to  
25 be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board of Pharmacy.

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

**ACCUSATION**

14 **Pharmacy Technician License No. TCH**  
15 **100859**

16 Respondent.

17 Complainant alleges:

18 **PARTIES**

19 1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity  
20 as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.

21 2. On or about April 20, 2010, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Technician  
22 License Number TCH 100859 to Cooper Joseph Winters (Respondent). The Pharmacy  
23 Technician License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein  
24 and will expire on April 30, 2012, unless renewed.

25 JURISDICTION

26 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of  
27 Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the  
28 Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.



1           4.     Section 4011 of the Code provides that the Board shall administer and enforce both  
2 the Pharmacy Law [Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled Substances  
3 Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.].

4           5.     Section 4300(a) of the Code provides that every license issued by the Board may be  
5 suspended or revoked.

6           6.     Section 118(b) of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the suspension, expiration,  
7 surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a  
8 disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued  
9 or reinstated.

10           7.     Section 4402(a) of the Code provides that any pharmacist license that is not renewed  
11 within three years following its expiration may not be renewed, restored, or reinstated and shall  
12 be canceled by operation of law at the end of the three-year period.

13           8.     Section 4402(e) of the Code provides that any other license issued by the Board may  
14 be canceled by the Board if not renewed within 60 days after its expiration, and any license  
15 canceled in this fashion may not be reissued but will instead require a new application to seek  
16 reissuance.

17   STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

18           9.     Section 4301 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board shall take action  
19 against any holder of a license who is guilty of "unprofessional conduct," defined to include, but  
20 not be limited to, any of the following:

21               (j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United  
22 States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

23               (o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the  
24 violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable  
25 federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by  
26 the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

27           10.    California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:  
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1 "For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license  
2 pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a  
3 crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a  
4 licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of a  
5 licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by her license or registration in a  
6 manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare."

7 11. Section 4060 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that no person shall possess any  
8 controlled substance, except that furnished upon a valid prescription/drug order.

9 12. Health and Safety Code section 11350, in pertinent part, makes it unlawful to possess  
10 cocaine.

11 COST RECOVERY

12 13. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the  
13 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation of the licensing  
14 act to pay a sum not to exceed its reasonable costs of investigation and enforcement.

15 CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES / DANGEROUS DRUGS

16 14. Section 4021 of the Code states:

17 "Controlled substance" means any substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section  
18 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code."

19 15. **Cocaine** is a Schedule I (in base/rock/crack form) or Schedule II controlled substance  
20 as designated by Health and Safety Code sections 11054(f)(1) and 11055(b)(6), and a dangerous  
21 drug as designated by Business and Professions Code section 4022. It is a narcotic drug.

22 FACTUAL BACKGROUND

23 16. On or about May 15, 2010, Respondent was parked on Hemlock Alley in San  
24 Francisco, California, an area known by police for auto theft and narcotics use. Officers from the  
25 San Francisco Police Department detained and arrested Respondent when he was discovered  
26 nervously attempting to put a plastic baggie containing white powder in his pocket. After  
27 investigation, the officers determined that the white powder was "cocaine salt."

1 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

2 (Possession of Controlled Substance)

3 17. Respondent is subject to discipline under section section(s) 4301(j), (o) and/or 4060  
4 of the Code, and/or Health and Safety Code section 11350, in that Respondent, as described in  
5 paragraph 16 above, possessed, conspired to possess, and/or assisted in or abetted possession of, a  
6 controlled substance, without a prescription.

7 SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

8 (Unprofessional Conduct)


9 18. Respondent is subject to discipline under section 4301 of the Code in that  
10 Respondent, as described in paragraph 16 above, engaged in unprofessional conduct.

11 PRAYER

12 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,  
13 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 14 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician License Number TCH 100859, issued
- 15 to Cooper Joseph Winters;
- 16 2. Ordering Cooper Joseph Winters to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs
- 17 of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code
- 18 section 125.3;
- 19 3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
