12	6. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds
13	Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the
14	relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as
15	taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on
16	file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 4184, finds that
17	the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4184, are separately and severally, found to be true
18	and correct by clear and convincing evidence.
19	7. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and
20	Professions Code ("Code") section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for
21	Investigation and Enforcement is \$1,207.50 as of May 14, 2012.
22	DETERMINATION OF ISSUES
23	1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Nazeli Heroian has subjected her
24	Technician Registration No.TCH 68388 to discipline.
25	2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
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3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case.

a. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Business and Professions Code (the Code) section 4059, (furnishing drugs), when she stole drugs from a pharmacy and sold them to a third party. The conduct is described in more particularity in Accusation No. 4184, inclusive and herein incorporated by reference.

b. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivisions (f) of the Code on grounds of dishonesty. The conduct is described in more particularity in Accusation No. 4184, inclusive and herein incorporated by reference.

Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivisions (q) of c. the Code on grounds of failing to cooperate with the Board's investigation. The conduct is described in more particularity in Accusation No. 4184, inclusive and herein incorporated by reference.

1	ORDER		
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3	IT IS SO ORDERED that Technician Registration No.TCH 68388, heretofore issued to		
4	Respondent Nazeli Heroian, is revoked.		
5	Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a		
6	written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within	i	
7	seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may		
8	vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.		
9	This Decision shall become effective on September 14, 2012.
