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18	<u>FINDINGS OF FACT</u> 1. On or about May 29, 2012, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity as			
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21	 the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed Accusation No. 4266 against Maureen Keshni Prasad (Respondent) before the Board of Pharmacy. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.) 2. On or about November 14, 2008, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 87120 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 4266 			
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27	and will expire on May 31, 2012, unless renewed.			
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Business and Professions Code section 118 (b) provides:

2 (b) The suspension, expiration, or forfeiture by operation of law of a license issued by a board in the department, or its suspension, forfeiture, or cancellation by 3 order of the board or by order of a court of law, or its surrender without the written consent of the board, shall not, during any period in which it may be renewed, 4 restored, reissued, or reinstated, deprive the board of its authority to institute or continue a disciplinary proceeding against the licensee upon any ground provided by 5 law or to enter an order suspending or revoking the license or otherwise taking disciplinary action against the licensee on any such ground. 6 On or about June 11, 2012, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail 4. 7 copies of Accusation 4266, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery. 8 and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at 9 Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100. 10 is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was 11 and is: 12 5280 Mack Road, #241 13 Sacramento, CA 95823. 5. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of 14 Government Code section 11505, subdivision (c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 15 124. 16 6. On or about June 14, 1012, the green return receipt was initialed and returned. The 17 documents sent via regular mail were not returned. 18 7. 19 Government Code section 11506 states, in pertinent part: 20 (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense, and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts 21 of the accusation not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion 22 may nevertheless grant a hearing. 8. Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of 23 the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 4266. 24 9. California Government Code section 11520 states, in pertinent part: 25 26 (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions 27 or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent. 28 2

DEFAULT DECISION AND ORDER

1 10. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds 2 Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the 3 relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as 4 taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on 5 file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 4266, finds that 6 the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 4266, are separately and severally, found to be true 7 and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

8 11. Taking official notice of its own internal records, pursuant to Business and
9 Professions Code section 125.3, it is hereby determined that the reasonable costs for Investigation
10 and Enforcement is \$637.00 as of July 25, 2012.

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DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Maureen Keshni Prasad has
 subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 87120 to discipline.

The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.

3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician
Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported
by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Evidence Packet in this case:

a. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under section 4301 (a) and (f) in that on
or about November 5, 2010 and December 15, 2010, while working as a cashier for Target
located at 5001 Madison Avenue, Sacramento, California, Respondent removed cash from her
register and placed it in her shoe. On December 15, 2010, in an interview with a store
investigator, Respondent admitted that she took cash from registers over time which amounted to
\$1,300.
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1	ORDER		
2	IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 87120, heretofore		
3	issued to Respondent Maureen Keshni Prasad, is revoked.		
4	Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a		
5	written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within		
6	seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may		
7	vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.		
8	This Decision shall become effective on October 15, 2012.
