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18	<u>FINDINGS OF FACT</u>		
19	1. On or about October 14, 2016, Complainant Virginia Herold, in her official capacity		
20	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs,		
21	filed Accusation No. 5516 against Safeway Pharmacy #2940 and Ayesha Niema Dixon		
22	(Respondent Dixon) before the Board of Pharmacy. (Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)		
23	2. On or about December 26, 2003, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration		
24	No. TCH 53272 to Respondent Dixon. The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force		
25	and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5516 and will expire on		
26	March 31, 2019, unless renewed.		
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- 3. On or about November 3, 2016, Respondent Dixon was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 5516, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent Dixon's address of record was and is: 907 Barrett Ave., Richmond, CA 94801.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505(c) and/or Business & Professions Code section 124.
- 5. The U.S. Postal Service did not return the aforementioned documents as undeliverable or otherwise indicate they were not received.
 - 6. Government Code section 11506(c) states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense . . . shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 7. The Board takes official notice of its records and the fact that Respondent Dixon failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 5516.
 - 8. California Government Code section 11520(a) states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense . . . or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent
- 9. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent Dixon is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 5516, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5516 as to Respondent Dixon alone are found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

ORDER 1 2 IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 53272, heretofore issued to Respondent Ayesha Niema Dixon, is revoked. 3 Pursuant to Government Code section 11520(c), Respondent may serve a written motion 4 5 requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may vacate the 6 7 Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute. 24	<u>PARTIES</u>	
25	1. Virginia Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as	
26	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs.	
27	2. On or about April 9, 2004, the Board issued Pharmacy License Number PHY 46760	
28	to Safeway Pharmacy (Respondent Pharmacy). The Pharmacy License was in full force and effect	
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at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and was cancelled on January 30, 2015, and has not been renewed.

- 3. On or about January 30, 2015, the Board issued Pharmacy License Number PHY 52250 to Respondent Pharmacy. The Pharmacy License Number was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on January 1, 2017, unless renewed.
- 4. On or about December 26, 2003, the Board issued Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 53272 to Ayesha Niema Dixon (Respondent Technician). The Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on March 31, 2017, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

- 5. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
- 6. Business and Professions Code (Code) section 4300 provides that every license issued by the Board may be suspended or revoked.
 - 7. Code section 4300.1 states:

"The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license."

STATUTORY AND REGULATORY PROVISIONS

- 8. Code section 4059 states:
- "(a) A person may not furnish any dangerous drug, except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7. A person may not furnish any dangerous device, except upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7.

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9. Code section 4060 states:

"A person shall not possess any controlled substance, except that furnished to a person upon the prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, optometrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7, or furnished pursuant to a drug order issued by a certified nurse-midwife pursuant to Section 2746.51, a nurse practitioner pursuant to Section 2836.1, a physician assistant pursuant to Section 3502.1, a naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.5, or a pharmacist pursuant to Section 4052.1, 4052.2, or 4052.6. This section does not apply to the possession of any controlled substance by a manufacturer, wholesaler, third-party logistics provider, pharmacy, pharmacist, physician, podiatrist, dentist, optometrist, veterinarian, naturopathic doctor, certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, or physician assistant, if in stock in containers correctly labeled with the name and address of the supplier or producer.

"This section does not authorize a certified nurse-midwife, a nurse practitioner, a physician assistant, or a naturopathic doctor, to order his or her own stock of dangerous drugs and devices."

10. Code section 4081 states:

"(a) All records of manufacture and of sale, acquisition, or disposition of dangerous drugs or dangerous devices shall be at all times during business hours open to inspection by authorized officers of the law, and shall be preserved for at least three years from the date of making. A current inventory shall be kept by every manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, veterinary food-animal drug retailer, physician, dentist, podiatrist, veterinarian, laboratory, clinic, hospital, institution, or establishment holding a currently valid and unrevoked certificate, license, permit, registration, or exemption under Division 2 (commencing with Section 1200) of the Health and Safety Code or under Part 4 (commencing with Section 16000) of Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code who maintains a stock of dangerous drugs or dangerous devices.

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11. Code section 4301 states:

"The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

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"(f)The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

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"(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

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"(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

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- 12. Health and Safety Code section 11350, in pertinent part, makes it unlawful to possess any controlled substance listed in Schedule II (Health and Safety Code section 11055), subdivision (b) or (c), or any narcotic drug in Schedules III-V, absent a valid prescription.
 - 13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1714, provides, in pertinent part:

"**..**.

"(b) Each pharmacy licensed by the board shall maintain its facilities, space, fixtures, and equipment so that drugs are safely and properly prepared, maintained, secured and distributed. The pharmacy shall be of sufficient size and unobstructed area to accommodate the safe practice of pharmacy.

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CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES/DANGEROUS DRUGS

14. Code section 4021 states:

""Controlled substance" means any substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code."

 15. Code section 4022 states:

""Dangerous drug" or "dangerous device" means any drug or device unsafe for self-use in humans or animals, and includes the following:

- "(a) Any drug that bears the legend: "Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," "Rx only," or words of similar import.
- "(b) Any device that bears the statement: "Caution: federal law restricts this device to sale by or on the order of a ______," "Rx only," or words of similar import, the blank to be filled in with the designation of the practitioner licensed to use or order use of the device.
- "(c) Any other drug or device that by federal or state law can be lawfully dispensed only on prescription or furnished pursuant to Section 4006."
- 16. Soma is a brand name for carisprodol, a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. Since January 11, 2012, carisprodol has been a Schedule IV controlled substance at the federal level (21 C.F.R. § 1308.14(c)(6)). It is a depressant drug.
- 17. Norco, Vicodin, Vicodin ES, Lortab, and Lorcet are among the brand names for compounds of varying dosages of acetaminophen (aka APAP) and hydrocodone, a Schedule III controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11056(e)(4) and dangerous drug as designated by Business and Professions Code section 4022. The varying compounds are also known generically as hydrocodone with APAP. These are all narcotic drugs. Products like these that combine hydrocodone with non-controlled substances are also called hydrocodone combination products. Effective October 6, 2014, hydrocodone combination productions were switched at the federal level from Schedule III (21 C.F.R. § 1308.13(e)(1)(iii) and (iv)) to Schedule II (21 C.F.R. § 1308.12(b)(1)). This includes hydrocodone with APAP drugs.
- 18. Phenergan with codeine is a brand name for a compound consisting of the antihistamine promethazine, a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022, and codeine, a Schedule V controlled substance as designated by Health and Safety Code section 11058 and a dangerous drug as designated by Code section 4022. This drug is also known generically as promethazine with codeine. It is an antihistamine/antitussive, a narcotic analgesic, and a sleep aid.

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy License Number PHY 46760, issued to Safeway Pharmacy #2940 (Respondent Pharmacy);
- 2. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy License Number PHY 52250, issued to Respondent Pharmacy;
- 3. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 53272, issued to Ayesha Niema Dixon (Respondent Technician);
- 4. Ordering Respondents to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and
 - 5. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
