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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 5701)

2. El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda dba Rosamond Pharmacy 1 2 and El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda are represented in this proceeding by attorney Herb L. Weinberg, whose address is: Fenton Law Group, LLP, 1990 S Bundy Drive 3 Suite 777, Los Angeles, CA 90025. 4 3. On or about November 5, 2004, the Board issued Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 46967 5 to El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda dba Rosamond Pharmacy 6 (Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy). The Pharmacy Permit was in full force and effect at all 7 8 times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 5701 and will expire on November 1, 2018, unless renewed. 9 4. On or about March 5, 1992, the Board issued Pharmacist License No. RPH 45022 to 10 El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda (Respondent Hamouda). The 11 Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in 12 Accusation No. 5701 and will expire on January 31, 2018, unless renewed. 13 JURISDICTION 14 Accusation No. 5701 was filed before the Board and is currently pending against 5. 15 Respondents. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served 16 on Respondents on July 27, 2017. Respondents timely filed their Notices of Defense contesting 17 the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 5701 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by 18 reference. 19 ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS 20 Respondents have carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understand the 6. 21 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5701. Respondents also have carefully read, fully 22 discussed with counsel, and understand the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and 23 Order. 24 Respondents are fully aware of their legal rights in this matter, including the right to a 7. 25 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine 26 the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on their own behalf; the 27 right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of 28 2

documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

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8. Respondents voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waive and give up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

9. Respondents admit the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation
No. 5701, agree that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrender Pharmacy Permit No. PHY
46967 and Pharmacist License No. RPH 45022 and for the Board's formal acceptance.

9 10. Respondents understand that by signing this stipulation they enable the Board to issue
10 an order accepting the surrender of the Pharmacy Permit and the Pharmacist License without
11 further process.

CONTINGENCY

11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondents understand 13 and agree that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with 14 the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by 15 Respondents or their counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondents understand and agree that 16 they may not withdraw their agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the 17 Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and 18 Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for 19 this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall 20 not be disgualified from further action by having considered this matter. 21

12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order

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1	may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
2	executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
3	14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
4	the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:
5	ORDER
6	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 46967 issued to Respondent El
• 7	Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda dba Rosamond Pharmacy (Respondent
8	Rosamond Pharmacy) is surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.
9	FURTHERMORE, IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacist License No. RPH 45022
10	issued to Respondent El Sayed B. A. Hamouda (Respondent Hamouda) is surrendered and
11	accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.
12	1. As to both the Pharmacy Permit and the Pharmacist License, this Order shall be
13	stayed until September 1, 2018, to allow for sale of the pharmacy.
14	2. The surrender of Respondents' Pharmacy Permit and Pharmacist License and the
15	acceptance of the surrendered permit and license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of
16	discipline against Respondents. This decision constitutes a record of discipline and shall become
17	a part of Respondents' license history with the Board. Respondents are required to report this
18	surrender as disciplinary action.
19	3. Respondents shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacy and Pharmacist in
20	California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order, or at the time the change of
21	ownership, whichever occurs first.
22	4. In the event that Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy is not sold by September 1, 2018,
23	Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy shall, within ten (10) days of the stayed effective date of the
24	Board's Order, arrange for the destruction of, the transfer to, sale of or storage in a facility
25	licensed and approved by the Board of all controlled substances and dangerous drugs and/or
26	dangerous devices. Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy shall further arrange for the transfer of all
27	records of acquisition and disposition of dangerous drugs to premises licensed and approved by
28	the Board. Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy shall further provide written proof of such
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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 5701)

disposition and submit a completed Discontinuance of Business form according to Board guidelines.

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5. In the event that Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy is not sold by September 1, 2018, 3 Respondent Rosamond Pharmacy shall within ten (10) days of the stayed effective date of the 4 Board's Order, arrange for the continuation of care for ongoing patients of the pharmacy by, at 5 minimum, providing a written notice to ongoing patients that specifies the anticipated closing 6 date of the pharmacy and that identifies one or more area pharmacies capable of taking up the 7 patients' care, and by cooperating as may be necessary in the transfer of records or prescriptions 8 for ongoing patients. Within five days of its provision to the pharmacy's ongoing patients, 9 Respondent shall provide a copy of the written notice to the Board. For the purposes of this 10 provision, "ongoing patients" means those patients for whom the pharmacy has on file a 11 prescription with one or more refills outstanding, or for whom the pharmacy has filled a 12 prescription within the preceding sixty (60) days. 13

6. Respondents understand and agree that if they ever file an application for licensure or
a licensed premises or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat
it as a new application for licensure.

7. Respondents may not reapply for any license from the Board for three (3) years from 17 the effective date of this decision. Respondents stipulate that should they apply for any license 18 from the Board on or after the effective date of this decision, all allegations set forth in the 19 Accusation No. 5701 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondents when the 20 Board determines whether to grant or deny the application. Respondents shall satisfy all 21 requirements applicable to that license as of the date the application is submitted to the Board, 22 including, but not limited to, taking and passing licensing examination(s) as well as fulfilling any 23 education or experience requirements prior to the issuance of a new license. 24

8. Respondent Hamouda shall relinquish his license, including any indicia of licensure
 issued by the Board, to the Board within ten (10) days of the effective date of this decision.
 Respondent Pharmacy shall relinquish the premises wall license and renewal license to the Board
 within ten (10) days of the effective date of this decision.

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Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 5701)

Respondents Rosamond Pharmacy and Hamouda stipulate that should either one of 9. them apply for any license from the Board on or after the effective date of this Decision the investigation and prosecution costs in the amount of \$16,485 shall be paid to the Board prior to issuance of the new license.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully 6 discussed it with my attorney, Herbert L. Weinberg. I understand the stipulation and the effect it 7 will have on the Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 46967 and Pharmacist License No. RPH 45022. I enter 8 into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board of Pharmacy. 10

8	JURISDICTION
9	4. This Accusation is brought before the California State Board of Pharmacy (Board),
10	Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section
11	references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.
12	5. Section 4300 of the Code provides, in part, that every license issued by the Board
13	is subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.
. 14	6. Section 4302 of the Code states:
15	. "The board may deny, suspend, or revoke any license of a corporation where conditions
. 16	exist in relation to any person holding 10 percent or more of the corporate stock of the
17	corporation, or where conditions exist in relation to any officer or director of the corporation that
18	would constitute grounds for disciplinary action against a licensee."
. 19	7. Section 4113 of the Code states, in part:
20	"(b) The pharmacist-in-charge shall be responsible for a pharmacy's compliance with all
21	state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy."
. 22	8. Section 118, subdivision (b), of the Code provides that the suspension, expiration,
23	surrender, or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a
24	disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued
25	or reinstated.
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	(EL SAYED B. A. HAMOUDA DBA ROSAMOND PHARMACY, ET AL.) ACCUSATION

1 STATUTORY AUTHORITY 9. Section 4301 of the Code states, in part: 2 "The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional 3 conduct . . . Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following: 4 5 "(d) The clearly excessive furnishing of controlled substances in violation of subdivision 6 (a) of Section 11153 of the Health and Safety Code. 7 8 9 "(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, or any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs. 10 11 "(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the 12 13 violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by 14 the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency." 15 10. Section 4306.5 of the Code states: 16 ÷ "Unprofessional conduct for a pharmacist may include any of the following: 17 "(a) Acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the inappropriate exercise of his 18 or her education, training, or experience as a pharmacist, whether or not the act or omission arises 19 in the course of the practice of pharmacy or the ownership, management, administration, or 20operation of a pharmacy or other entity licensed by the board. -21 "(b) Acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the failure to exercise or 22 implement his or her best professional judgment or corresponding responsibility with regard to 23 the dispensing or furnishing of controlled substances, dangerous drugs, or dangerous devices, or 24 with regard to the provision of services. 25 "(c) Acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the failure to consult appropriate 26 patient, prescription, and other records pertaining to the performance of any pharmacy function. 27 111 28 3

"(d) Acts or omissions that involve, in whole or in part, the failure to fully maintain and retain appropriate patient-specific information pertaining to the performance of any pharmacy function."

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12. Section 4307, subdivision (a), of the Code states that:

"Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under 5 suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who 6 has been a manager, administrator, owner member, officer, director, associate, or partner of any 7 partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or 8 revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manger, 9 administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner had knowledge or knowingly 10 participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on 11 probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manger, administrator, owner, member, officer, 12 director, associate, or partner of a licensee as follows: 13

(1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on
probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.

16 (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the
17 license is issued or reinstated."

STATE REGULATORY AUTHORITY

11. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1707.3 states:

20 "Prior to consultation as set forth in section 1707.2, a pharmacist shall review a patient's
21 drug therapy and medication record before each prescription drug is delivered. The review shall
22 include screening for severe potential drug therapy problems."

12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1718 states:

24 "Current Inventory' as used in Sections 4081 and 4332 of the Business and Professions
25 Code shall be considered to include complete accountability for all dangerous drugs handled by
26 every licensee enumerated in Sections 4081 and 4332.

The controlled substances inventories required by Title 21, CFR, Section 1304 shall be available for inspection upon request for at least 3 years after the date of the inventory."

13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1761 states, in part:
"(a) No pharmacist shall compound or dispense any prescription which contains any significant error, omission, irregularity, uncertainty, ambiguity or alteration. Upon receipt of any such prescription, the pharmacist shall contact the prescriber to obtain the information needed to validate the prescription.

6 "(b) Even after conferring with the prescriber, a pharmacist shall not compound or
7 dispense a controlled substance prescription where the pharmacist knows or has objective reason
8 to know that said prescription was not issued for a legitimate medical purpose."

'HEALTH AND SAFETY CODES

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14. Health and Safety Code section 11153 states, in part:

"(a) A prescription for a controlled substance shall only be issued for a legitimate medical 11 purpose by an individual practitioner acting in the usual course of his or her professional practice. 12 The responsibility for the proper prescribing and dispensing of controlled substances is upon the 13 prescribing practitioner, but a corresponding responsibility rests with the pharmacist who fills the 14 15 prescription. Except as authorized by this division, the following are not legal prescriptions: (1) an order purporting to be a prescription which is issued not in the usual course of professional 16 treatment or in legitimate and authorized research; or (2) an order for an addict or habitual user of 17 controlled substances, which is issued not in the course of professional treatment or as part of an 18 authorized narcotic treatment program, for the purpose of providing the user with controlled 19 substances, sufficient to keep him or her comfortable by maintaining customary use." 20

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15. Health and Safety Code Section 11162.1 states, in part:

"(a) The prescription forms for controlled substances shall be printed with the following
features: ... (2) A watermark shall be printed on the backside of the prescription blank; the
watermark shall consist of the words "California Security Prescription." ... (4) A feature printed
in thermochromic ink ... (6) A description of the security features included on each prescription
form. ... (8) Prescription blanks shall contain a statement printed on the bottom of the
prescription blank that the "Prescription is void if the number of drugs prescribed is not noted" ...
(13) An identifying number assigned to the approved security printer by the Department of

Justice... (b) Each batch of controlled substance prescription forms shall have the lot number
 printed on the form and each form within that batch shall be numbered sequentially beginning
 with the numeral one."

16. Health and Safety Code Section 11164 states, in part:

"[N]o person shall prescribe a controlled substance, nor shall any person fill, compound, or dispense a prescription for a controlled substance, unless it complies with the requirements of this section. (a) Each prescription for a controlled substance . . . shall be made on a controlled substance prescription form as specified in Section 11162.1."

FEDERAL REGULATIONS

10 17. Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1304.11, states, in pertinent part:
11 "b. Initial inventory date. Every person required to keep records shall take an inventory of
12 all stocks of controlled substances on hand on the date he/she first engages in the manufacture,
13 distribution, or dispensing of controlled substances, in accordance with paragraph (e) of this
14 section as applicable. In the event a person commences business with no controlled substances on
15 hand, he/she shall record this fact as the initial inventory.

"c. Biennial inventory date. After the initial inventory is taken, the registrant shall take a
new inventory of all stocks of controlled substances on hand at least every two years. The biennial
inventory may be taken on any date which is within two years of the previous biennial inventory
date."

COST RECOVERY

18. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in part, that the Board may request the
administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Assume Corresponding Responsibility)

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Respondent Pharmacy and Respondent Hamouda are subject to discipline pursuant to 20. Code sections 4301, subdivision (d), (j) and (o), 4302, and 4113, on the grounds of unprofessional 21 conduct, in that they failed to assume their corresponding responsibility to ensure that controlled 22 substances are dispensed for a legitimate medical purpose, in violation of Code section 4306.5, 23 Health and Safety Code section 11153, and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1761, 24 subdivisions (a) and (b). Respondents failed to exercise their best professional judgment and 25 evaluate the totality of the circumstances (information from the patient, physician and other 26 sources) to determine a prescription's legitimate medical purpose, in connection with the 27 prescribers' controlled substance prescriptions. Respondents ignored numerous warning signs or 28

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red flags that should put a reasonable and prudent dispensing pharmacist on notice that a
 prescription may not have been issued for a legitimate medical purpose. The red flags included,
 but were not limited to the following:

4 21. Between January 1, 2012, and June 11, 2015, Respondent Pharmacy filled 5,405
5 prescriptions for 416 patients under the prescribing authority of Drs. Madhu Garg¹, H.A., H.F.,
6 R.G., E.H., D.H., S.J., C.O., C.P., H.P., S.S., and A.W., and Physician Assistant L.L. Objective
7 factors indicating the medical illegitimacy of the prescriptions of commonly abused controlled
8 substances attributed to these prescribers included the following:

9 a. Driving distances of approximately 70 to 90 miles between the prescribers' offices
10 and Respondent Pharmacy's facility for Drs. Garg, H.A., H.F., R.G., C.O., C.P., H.P., S.S., and
11 A.W., and PA L.L.

b. The prescribing profiles for the listed prescribers consisting almost entirely of
controlled substances.

c. The prescribing profiles for the listed prescribers consisting almost entirely of
prescriptions paid in cash, without the assistance of prescription insurance.

d. Irregularities on the prescription forms including:

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i. Misspellings of the brand name Roxicodone

ii. Irregularly shaped prescription forms, i.e., not in the usual rectangular shape.

iii. Multiple prescription forms with the same form number

iv. Varying signatures on one prescriber's prescription forms

e. Prescribing patterns for some of the listed prescribers which were seemingly

22 incongruent with the physicians' specialty listed on BreEZe.² Examples included the following:

¹ In or about January 2015, Dr. Madhu Garg was federally indicted for writing prescriptions for controlled substances for patients without a medical need as part of an illegal narcotics trafficking ring. In or about February 2016, Dr. Garg plead guilty to one count of illegally distributing oxycodone and one count of money laundering for transferring the proceeds of criminal activity to a Malaysian bank account. The Medical Board of California revoked Garg's medical license in December 2013, due to her self-abuse of controlled substances. The Board of Pharmacy initiated an investigation at Respondent Pharmacy due to an analysis of CURES data, which showed Respondent Pharmacy filled a portion of Dr. Garg's prescriptions.
² BreEZe is the Department of Consumer Affairs' online licensing and enforcement system.

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i. Dr. R.G., a rheumatologist, prescribing promethazine/codeine cough syrup more
 often than any other medication.

3 ii. Dr. H.A., an obstetrician/gynecologist, prescribing alprazolam 2 mg tablets
4 more than any other medication without prescribing oral contraceptives or vaginal antibiotics or
5 antifungals.

6 ii. Dr. H.P., a surgeon, prescribing alprazolam 2 mg tablets for all of his patients.
7 f. The prescribing profiles for the listed practitioners containing almost exclusively the
8 highest available doses of the medications. Drs. Garg, C.P., H.A., S.S., H.P., H.F., and S.J.
9 prescribed large quantities of alprazolam 2 mg tablets and oxycodone 30 mg tablets without
10 prescribing any lower strengths of alprazolam and oxycodone.

g. The dispensing histories of many patients consisting only of controlled substances,
purchased in cash, and written by prescribers from out of the pharmacy's normal trade area.

h. Respondent Pharmacy did not have any records of verification for the prescriptions
identified in the documents that were collected during the Board's inspection.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Required Forms for Controlled Substance Prescriptions)

Respondent Pharmacy and Respondent Hamouda are subject to discipline pursuant to 17 22. Code sections 4301, subdivision (j) and (o), and 4113, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, 18 by filling prescriptions that were not written on controlled substance prescription forms as 19 specified in Health and Safety Code Section 11162.1, in violation of Health and Safety Code 20 Section 11164. Specifically, between January 24, 2013, and May 11, 2015, Respondent 21 Pharmacy filled at least 53 prescriptions under the prescribing authority of Drs. R.G., H.A., A.W., 22 E.H., C.P., C.O., D.H., and PA L.L. pursuant to prescriptions written on forms that did not 23 comply with the requirements of Health and Safety Code Section 11162.1. The prescription 24 forms lacked a watermark consisting of the words "California Security Prescription", a feature 25 printed in thermochromic ink, and an identifying number assigned to the security printer by the 26 Department of Justice, and other requirements. 27

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1	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
2	(Failure to Conduct DEA Biennial Inventory)
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4	Code sections 4301, subdivision (o), and 4113, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that
5	they violated Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1304.11 and California Code of
6	Regulations, title 16, section 1718, by failing to conduct the Drug Enforcement Administration
7	(DEA) biennial inventory of controlled substances as required. Specifically, on or about June 12,
8	2015, during a Board inspection of Respondent Pharmacy's facility, located at 1415 Rosamond
9	Boulevard, Suite 22, Rosamond, California, the Board inspector found that the most recent DEA
10	biennial inventory of controlled substances completed by Respondent Hamouda was in January
11	2013.
12	FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
13	(Unprofessional Conduct)
14	24. Respondent Pharmacy and Respondent Hamouda are subject to discipline pursuant
15	to Code sections 4301 and 4113, in that Respondents committed unprofessional conduct, as more
16	fully discussed in paragraphs 20 through 23, above.
17	OTHER MATTERS
18	25. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number
19	PHY 46967 issued to El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda dba Rosamond
20	Pharmacy, while El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda has been an officer
21	and owner and had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the licensee
22	was disciplined, El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda shall be prohibited
23	from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner
24	of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 46967 is placed on probation or
25	until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 46967 is reinstated if it is revoked.
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DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS

2 26. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Pharmacy, 3 Complainant alleges that on or about November 2, 2011, in a prior action, the Board of Pharmacy issued Citation Number CI 2009 44516 to Respondent Pharmacy and ordered it to pay a fine of 4 5 \$3,350, for violating Code section 4125 and California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections 6 1715, subdivision (a), 1793.7, subdivision (c), 1793.7, subdivision (a), 1716, and 1711, subdivisions (d) and (e) and 21 Code of Federal Regulations section 1306.22, subdivision (b). 7 That Citation is now final and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth. The Citation has 8 been paid in full. 9

To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Hamouda,
Complainant alleges that on or about November 2, 2011, in a prior action, the Board of Pharmacy
issued Citation Number CI 20011 49809 to Respondent Hamouda and ordered him to pay a fine
of \$5,250, for violating Code section 4125 and California Code of Regulations, title 16, sections
1715, subdivision (a), 1793.7, subdivision (c), 1793.7, subdivision (a), 1716, and 1711,
subdivisions (d) and (e) and 21 Code of Federal Regulations section 1306.22, subdivision (b).

16 That Citation is now final and is incorporated by reference as if fully set forth. The Citation has17 been paid in full.

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1	<u>PRAYER</u>
2	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:
3	1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Permit License Number PHY 46967, issued to El
4	Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda dba Rosamond Pharmacy;
5	2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 45022, issued to El Sayed
6 7	B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda;
	3. Prohibiting El Sayed B. A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda from serving as
8	a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for
10	five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 46967 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy
10	Permit Number PHY 46967 is reinstated if Pharmacy Permit Number 50434 issued to El Sayed B.
12	A. Hamouda, aka El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda dba Rosamond Pharmacy is revoked;
13	4. Ordering El Sayed Ahmed Hamouda to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable
14	costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code
15	section 125.3;
16	5. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
