PARTIES

- 1. Virginia Herold ("Complainant") is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy ("Board"). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Malissa N. Siemantel, Deputy Attorney General.
- 2. Respondent Julie Catherine May ("Respondent May") is representing herself in this proceeding and has chosen not to exercise her right to be represented by counsel.

JURISDICTION

- 3. On or about September 27, 2009, the Board issued Original Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 93974 to Julie Catherine May ("Respondent May"). The Original Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on May 31, 2019, unless renewed.
- 4. Accusation No. 5757 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy ("Board"), Department of Consumer Affairs, and is currently pending against Respondent May. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent May on September 28, 2016. Respondent May timely filed her Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 5757 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent May has carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 5757. Respondent May has also carefully read, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval.
- 6. Respondent May is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel at her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

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7. Respondent May voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

- 8. Respondent May admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 5757.
- 9. Respondent May agrees that her Original Pharmacy Technician Registration is subject to discipline and she agrees to be bound by the Disciplinary Order below.

CONTINGENCY

- 10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent May understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent May. By signing the stipulation, Respondent May understands and agrees that she may not withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 11. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval may not be altered, amended, modified,

supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Disciplinary Order:

DISCIPLINARY ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Original Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 93974 issued to Respondent Julie Catherine May ("Respondent May") shall be publicly reproved by the Board of Pharmacy under Business and Professions Code section 495 in resolution of Accusation No. 5757, attached as exhibit A.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Respondent May shall comply with terms and conditions as set forth below. Any violation of the terms and conditions shall constitute unprofessional conduct and grounds for further disciplinary action.

Cost Recovery. Respondent May shall pay \$500 within sixty (60) days to the Board for its costs associated with the investigation and enforcement of this matter. Respondent May shall be permitted to pay these costs in a payment plan approved by the Board. If Respondent May fails to pay the Board costs as ordered, Respondent May shall not be allowed to renew her Original Pharmacy Technician Registration until Respondent May pays costs in full.

Remedial Education. Within sixty (60) days of the effective date of this decision, Respondent May shall submit to the Board or its designee, for prior approval, an appropriate program of remedial education related to pharmacy law for pharmacy technicians, ethics for pharmacy technicians, and any pharmacy technician related courses. The program of remedial education shall consist of at least ten (10) hours to be completed within twenty-four (24) months at Respondent May's own expense. All remedial education shall be in addition to, and shall not be credited toward, continuing education (CE) courses used for license renewal purposes.

Following the completion of each course, the Board or its designee may require Respondent May, at her own expense, to take an approved examination to test Respondent May's knowledge of the course. If Respondent May does not achieve a passing score on the examination,

Respondent May shall take another course approved by the Board in the same subject area. **ACCEPTANCE** 2 I have carefully read the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval. 3 I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Original Pharmacy Technician 4 Registration. 3	1. Complainant brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity as the Executive

6	2. On or about October 9, 2013, the Board issued Original Pharmacy Permit Number		
7	PHY 51582 to Lisa Family Pharmacy Inc. doing business as Lisa Family Pharmacy ("Responde		
8	Lisa Family Pharmacy"), with Lisa Susanne Hohenthaner, President and Pharmacist-in-Charge.		
9	The Original Pharmacy Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges		
10	brought herein and will expire on October 1, 2016, unless renewed.		
11	Pharmacist License – Lisa Susanne Hohenthaner		
12	3. On or about July 2, 2010, the Board issued Original Pharmacist License Number RPI		
13	63937 to Lisa Susanne Hohenthaner ("Respondent Hohenthaner"). The Original Pharmacist

16	4. On or about September 27, 2009, the Board issued Original Pharmacy Technician		
17	Registration Number TCH 93974 to Julie Catherine May ("Respondent May"). The Original		
18	Pharmacy Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges		
19	brought herein and will expire on May 31, 2017, unless renewed.		
20	<u>JURISDICTION</u>		
21	5. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following		
22	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code ("Code") unless otherwise		
23	indicated.		
24	6. Code section 4083 states, in pertinent part:		
25	(a) An inspector may issue an order of correction to a licensee directing the		
26	licensee to comply with this chapter or regulations adopted pursuant to this chapter.		
27	(f) Nothing in this section shall in any way limit the board's authority or ability to do any of the following:

- 11. Code section 4023.5 states, "For the purposes of this chapter, 'direct supervision and control' means that a pharmacist is on the premises at all times and is fully aware of all activities performed by either a pharmacy technician or intern pharmacist."
- 12. California Code of Regulations ("Regulations), title 16, section 1714(d) states, in pertinent part:

Each pharmacist while on duty shall be responsible for the security of the prescription department, including provisions for effective control against theft or diversion of dangerous drugs and devices, and records for such drugs and devices. Possession of a key to the pharmacy where dangerous drugs and controlled substances are stored shall be restricted to a pharmacist.

- 13. Code section 4115 states, in pertinent part:
- (a) A pharmacy technician may perform packaging, manipulative, repetitive, or other nondiscretionary tasks only while assisting, and while under the direct supervision and control of, a pharmacist. The pharmacist shall be responsible for the duties performed under his or her supervision by a technician.
- (h) The pharmacist on duty shall be directly responsible for the conduct of a pharmacy technician supervised by that pharmacist.
- 14. Regulations section 1793.7 states, in pertinent part:
- (b) Pharmacy technicians must work under the direct supervision of a pharmacist and in such a relationship that the supervising pharmacist is fully aware of all activities involved in the preparation and dispensing of medications, including the maintenance of appropriate records.
- (e) A pharmacist shall be responsible for all activities of pharmacy technicians to ensure that all such activities are performed completely, safely and without risk of harm to patients.
- 15. Regulations section 1793.1 states, in pertinent part,

Only a pharmacist, or an intern pharmacist acting under the supervision of a pharmacist, may:

- (e) Consult with any prescriber, nurse or other health care professional or authorized agent thereof.
- 16. Code section 4070(a) states:

Except as provided in Section 4019 and subdivision (b), an oral or an electronic data transmission prescription as defined in subdivision (c) of Section 4040 shall as soon as practicable be reduced to writing by the pharmacist and shall be filled by, or under the direction of, the pharmacist. The pharmacist need not reduce to writing the address, telephone number, license classification, federal registry number of the prescriber or the address of the patient or patients if the information is readily retrievable in the pharmacy.

17. Regulation 1717(c) states:

Promptly upon receipt of an orally transmitted prescription, the pharmacist shall reduce it to writing, and initial it, and identify it as an orally transmitted prescription. If the prescription is then dispensed by another pharmacist, the dispensing pharmacist shall also initial the prescription to identify him or herself. All orally transmitted prescriptions shall be received and transcribed by a pharmacist prior to compounding, filling, dispensing, or furnishing. Chart orders as defined in section 4019 of the Business and Professions Code are not subject to the provisions of this subsection.

- 18. Regulation 1793.1 states, in pertinent part: "Only a pharmacist, or an intern pharmacist acting under the supervision of a pharmacist, may: (a) Receive a new prescription order orally from a prescriber or other person authorized by law."
 - 19. United States Code, title 21, section 829(b) states:

Schedule III and IV substances. Except when dispensed directly by a practitioner, other than a pharmacist, to an ultimate user, no controlled substance in schedule III or IV, which is a prescription drug as determined under the Federal Food, Drug, and Cosmetic Act [21 USCS §§ 301 et seq.], may be dispensed without a written or oral prescription in conformity with section 503(b) of that Act [21 USCS § 353(b)]. Such prescriptions may not be filled or refilled more than six months after the date thereof or be refilled more than five times after the date of the prescription unless renewed by the practitioner.

20. The Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1306.22(a) states:

No prescription for a controlled substance listed in Schedule III or IV shall be filled or refilled more than six months after the date on which such prescription was issued. No prescription for a controlled substance listed in Schedule III or IV authorized to be refilled may be refilled more than five times.

21. Code section 4307 states, in pertinent part:

- (a) Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee as follows:
- (1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.

- (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated.
- (b) "Manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner," as used in this section and Section 4308, may refer to a pharmacist or to any other person who serves in that capacity in or for a licensee.

COST RECOVERY

22. Code section 125.3 provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licentiate to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

<u>INSPECTION – SEPTEMBER 2, 2015</u>

- 23. On or about September 2, 2015, a Board inspector (the "inspector") arrived prior to 09:00 hours at the premises of Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy in Magalia, California, to conduct an inspection. The inspector attempted to enter, but the premises was locked and appeared uninhabited. The inspector observed a car drive behind the store and the door to the store was subsequently unlocked. At approximately 09:05 hours, the inspector entered the facility. The inspector approached the counter, which was attended to by Respondent May, and asked to see the pharmacist. Respondent May told the operator that Respondent Hohenthaner was on the phone. The operator observed two more individuals, later identified as pharmacy technicians "O.W." and "S.B.", enter the premises. The inspector again asked the whereabouts of the pharmacist. Respondent May finally told the inspector that she had unlocked and accessed the pharmacy and that Respondent Hohenthaner usually arrived at 09:30 hours. The inspector said the pharmacy needed to be closed. Respondent May locked the doors to the pharmacy with the keys Respondent May had in her possession. The inspector then retained control of the keys to the pharmacy until Respondent Hohenthaner arrived at approximately 09:20 hours.
- 24. In the course of the inspection, Respondent Hohenthaner confirmed that two scripts for Tramadol, dated February 26, 2015, and February 27, 2015, had been transcribed by

pharmacy technicians, who printed the initials "LH", where the pharmacist was to sign or initial. Tramadol is a Schedule IV controlled substance pursuant to Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1308.14(b)(3).

- 25. The investigator found a script for Temazepam containing the notation "OK per Ann to change to one 30 mg tab and one 15 mg. tab to equal 45 mg." The note was dated March 11, 2015, and was initialed by Respondent May. Temazepam is a Schedule IV controlled substance pursuant to Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1308.14(c)(50).
- 26. On or about November 10, 2015, the inspector returned to Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy. The investigator obtained a patient profile for patient "D.C." for the period November 10, 2013 to November 10, 2015. The inspector noted that Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy refilled D.C.'s prescription for Carisoprodol, originally prescribed on April 27, 2015, seven times between the original fill date, April 27, 2015, and July 27, 2015. Carisoprodol is designated a Schedule IV controlled substance pursuant to Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1308.14(c)(6).

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violations of Federal and State Laws or Regulations Governing Pharmacy)

- 27. Paragraphs 23 through 26, above, are incorporated herein as though fully set forth.

 Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy and Respondent Hohenthaner are subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 4301(o), on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that they violated statutes and regulations applicable to governing pharmacy, as follows:
- a. On or about September 2, 2015, Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy and Respondent Hohenthaner failed to ensure that possession of a key to the pharmacy was restricted to a pharmacist, in violation of Regulation 1714(d).
- b. On or about September 2, 2015, Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy and Respondent Hohenthaner failed to ensure that Respondent May, O.W., and S.B., pharmacy technicians and employees of Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy, were under the direct supervision and control of a pharmacist, in violation of Code section 4023.5, and Regulation section 1793.7(b).

- c. On or about February 26, 2015, and February 27, 2015, Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy and Respondent Hohenthaner allowed someone other than a pharmacist to transcribe oral prescriptions for Tramadol, a controlled substance, in violation of Code section 4070(a) and Regulations 1717(c) and 1793.1(a).
- d. Between the original prescription date on or about April 27, 2015, and July 27, 2015, Respondent Pharmacy and Respondent Hohenthaner refilled D.C.'s prescription for Carisoprodol, a Schedule IV controlled substance pursuant to Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1308.14(c)(6), seven times, in violation of United States Code, title 21, section 829(b), and the Code of Federal Regulations, title 21, section 1306.22.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of State Laws and Regulations Governing Pharmacy by Pharmacy Technician)

- 28. Paragraphs 23 and 25, above, are incorporated herein as though fully set forth. Respondent May is subject to discipline pursuant to Code section 4301(o) on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that she violated statutes and regulations applicable to governing pharmacy, as follows:
- a. On or about September 2, 2015, Respondent May possessed a key to Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy's premises, which she used to access, open, and commence work as a pharmacy technician in the pharmacy when a pharmacist was not present, in violation of Regulation 1714(d), and 1793.7(b).
- b. On or about March 11, 2015, Respondent May consulted a health care professional or their authorized agent regarding a patient's prescription for Temazepam, a Schedule IV controlled substance, in violation of Regulation 1793.1(e) and Code section 4115.

MATTERS IN AGGRAVATION

29. To determine the degree of discipline to be assessed against Respondent Lisa Family Pharmacy and Respondent Hohenthaner, if any, on or about April 22, 2014, in the course of an inspection of the pharmacy, "P.P.", a Board inspector, waited approximately 40 minutes for Respondent Hohenthaner to return to the pharmacy. Respondent Hohenthaner was advised by

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PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 3. Prohibiting Lisa Susanne Hohenthaner from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of any licensed or permitted entity for five (5) years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 51582 is placed on probation, or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 51582 is reinstated, if revoked;
- Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Technician Registration Number TCH 93974, issued to Julie Catherine May;
- 5. Ordering to Lisa Family Pharmacy Inc., doing business as Lisa Family Pharmacy, Lisa Susanne Hohenthaner, and/or Julie Catherine May to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3;
