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21	IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-		
22	entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:		
23	<u>PARTIES</u>		
24	Virginia Herold (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy		
25	(Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by		
26	Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Desiree I. Kellogg, Deputy		
27	Attorney General.		
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- 2. Pharmacy 9, Julie Tran and Duyen Thi Tran, owners (Respondent Pharmacy 9) and Duyen Thi Tran (Respondent Duyen Thi Tran) are representing themselves in this proceeding and have chosen not to exercise their right to be represented by counsel.
- 3. On or about June 21, 1995, the Board issued Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 40841 to Respondent Pharmacy 9 with Julie Tran designated as the owner of fifty percent of the outstanding shares and Respondent Duyen Tran as the owner of fifty percent of the outstanding shares. The Pharmacy Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges and allegations brought in Accusation No. 6178 and will expire on June 1, 2018, unless renewed.
- 4. On or about October 28, 1992, the Board issued Pharmacist License No. RPH 45895 to Respondent Duyen Tran. The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges and allegations brought herein and will expire on February 29, 2020, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

5. Accusation No. 6178 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against Respondents. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondents on February 16, 2018. Respondents timely filed their Notices of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 6178 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- Respondents have carefully read, and understand the charges and allegations in
 Accusation No. 6178. Respondents also have carefully read, and understand the effects of this
 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.
- 7. Respondents are fully aware of their legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at their own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on their own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration

and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

8. Respondents voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waive and give up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

- 9. Respondents admit the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 6178, agree that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrender Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 40841 and Pharmacist License No. RPH 45895 for the Board's formal acceptance.
- 10. Respondents understand that by signing this stipulation, Respondents Pharmacy 9 and Duyen Tran enables the Board to issue an order accepting the surrender of their Pharmacy Permit and Pharmacist License without further process.

CONTINGENCY

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondents understand and agree that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondents. By signing the stipulation, Respondents understand and agree that they may not withdraw their agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order

may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

14. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 40841, issued to Respondent Pharmacy 9, Julie Tran and Duyen Thi Tran, owners and Pharmacist License No. RPH 45895, issued to Duyen Thi Tran are surrendered and accepted by the Board of Pharmacy.

- 1. The surrender of Respondent Pharmacy 9's Pharmacy Permit and Respondent Duyen Thi Tran's Pharmacist License and the acceptance of the surrendered licenses by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondents. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondents' license history with the Board of Pharmacy.
- 2. Respondent Duyen Thi Tran shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacist in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 3. Respondent Pharmacy 9 shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
- 4. Respondents shall cause to be delivered to the Board their pocket licenses and, if one was issued, its wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 5. If Respondents ever apply for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondents must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 6178 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondents when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.
- 6. Respondents shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the amount of \$14,052.50 (\$12,1000.00 in investigative costs and \$1,952.50 in prosecution costs) prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

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- 7. If Respondents should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 6178 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondents for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.
- 8. Within (30) days of the effective date of the Order adopting this Stipulated Surrender, Respondent Pharmacy 9 shall arrange for the destruction of, the transfer to, sale of or storage in a facility licensed by the Board of all controlled substances and dangerous drugs and devices. Respondent Pharmacy 9 shall further provide written proof of such disposition and submit a completed Discontinuance of Business form according to Board guidelines.
- 9. Within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Order adopting this Stipulated Surrender, Respondent Pharmacy 9 shall arrange for the continuation of care for ongoing patients of the pharmacy, by at minimum, providing a written notice to ongoing patients that specifies the anticipated closing date of the pharmacy and that identifies one or more area pharmacies capable of taking up the patients' care, and by cooperating as may be necessary in the transfer of records or prescriptions for ongoing patients. Within five (5) days of satisfaction of this provision to the pharmacy's ongoing patients, Respondent Pharmacy 9 shall provide a copy of the written notice to the board. For the purposes of this provision, "ongoing patients" means those patients for whom the pharmacy has on file a prescription with one or more refills outstanding, or for whom the pharmacy has filled a prescription within the preceding sixty (60) days.
- 10. Respondents may not apply, reapply, or petition for any licensure or registration of the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of the Decision and Order.
- 11. Owners of Respondent Pharmacy 9, Julie Tran and Respondent Duyen Tran shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of any entity licensed by the Board until the pharmacist license or pharmacy permit are issued or reinstated.

ACCEPTANCE

I, as the authorized agent on behalf of Pharmacy 9 have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Pharmacy Permit. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board of Pharmacy.

22	PARTIES		
23	1. Virginia K. Herold (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official		
24	capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
25	2. On or about June 21, 1995, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Permit Number		
26	PHY 40841 to Pharmacy 9 (Pharmacy 9). The Pharmacy Permit was in full force and effect at all		
27	times relevant to the charges and allegations brought herein and will expire on June 1, 2018,		
28	unless renewed.		
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10. Section 4040(a)(2) of the Code states:

'Prescription' means an oral, written, or electronic transmission order that is both of the following:

Issued by a physician, dentist, optometrist, podiatrist, veterinarian, or naturopathic doctor pursuant to Section 3640.7 or, if a drug order is used pursuant to Section 2746.51, 2836.1, 3502.1 or 3460.5, by a certified nurse-midwife, nurse practitioner, physician assistant or naturopathic doctor licensed in this state, or pursuant to Section 4052.1, 4052.2, or 4052.6 by a pharmacist licensed in this state.

11. Section 4113(c) of the Code states:

The pharmacist-in-charge shall be responsible for a pharmacy's compliance with all state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy.

12. Section 4301 of the Code states in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

. . .

(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or any other state or federal regulatory agency.

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13. Section 4307(a) of the Code states that:

Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner member, officer, director, associate, or partner of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manger, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner had knowledge or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manger, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee as follows:

- (1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.
- (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated.

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14. Section 1707.5(d) of California Code of Regulations, title 16 states:

The pharmacy shall have policies and procedures in place to help patients with limited or no English proficiency understand the information on the label as specified in subdivision (a) in the patient's language. The pharmacy's policies and procedures shall be specified in writing and shall include, at minimum, the selected means to identify the patient's language and to provide interpretative services in the patient's language. The pharmacy shall, at minimum, provide interpretive services in the patient's language, if interpretative services in such language are available, during all hours that the pharmacy is open, either in person by pharmacy staff or by use of a third-party interpretive service available by telephone at or adjacent to the pharmacy counter.

COST RECOVERY

15. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- 16. Since on or about June 21, 1995, Duyen Tran was the Pharmacist-in-Charge and fifty percent shareholder of Pharmacy 9, and Julie Tran was the other fifty percent owner of Pharmacy 9.
- 17. On or about January 12, 2006, Julie Tran became licensed as a physician assistant by the Physician Assistant Board and authorized to write prescriptions.
- 18. Subsequently, Pharmacy 9 submitted renewal applications for its permit but never disclosed that Julie Tran had become licensed as a physician assistant.
- 19. On June 23, 2016, a Board inspector informed Julie Tran and Duyen Tran that Julie Tran could not be an owner of Pharmacy 9 because Julie Tran was licensed as a physician assistant who could prescribe controlled substances and dangerous drugs. Julie Tran informed the inspector that she would relinquish ownership of Pharmacy 9. The inspector further informed them to submit change of ownership paperwork immediately. The Board then issued a notice of non-compliance. However, Respondents did not remove Julie Tran from the ownership of the pharmacy.

- 20. On September 28, 2016, a Board inspector again informed Julie Tran and Duyen Tran that Julie Tran could not be an owner of Pharmacy 9 because Julie Tran was licensed as a physician assistant who could prescribe drugs. The Board issued yet another notice of non-compliance. However, Respondents did not remove Julie Tran from the ownership of the pharmacy.
- 21. Respondents did not possess policies and procedures in place for interpretative services despite being advised to obtain them by the Board.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Illegal Prescriber Ownership of Pharmacy)

22. Respondents are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301(o), for violating Business and Professions Code section 4111(a)(1), in that the fifty percent owner, Julie Tran was a prescriber who was restricted from owning Pharmacy 9, but failed to relinquish her ownership, as set forth in paragraphs 15 through 21, which are incorporated herein by reference.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Possess Interpretative Services Policies and Procedures)

23. Respondents are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301(o), for violating title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 1707.5(d), in that they did not have policies and procedures in place for interpretative services, as set forth in paragraphs 15 through 21, which are incorporated herein by reference.

THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct)

24. Respondents are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, for unprofessional conduct in that they engaged in the activities described in paragraphs 15 through 21 above, which are incorporated herein by reference.

OTHER MATTERS

25. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 issued to Pharmacy 9, Pharmacy 9 shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if

Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 is reinstated if it is revoked.

- 26. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 issued to Pharmacy 9 while Julie Tran and/or Duyen Tran have been an officer and owner and had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the licensee was disciplined, Julie Tran and Duyen Tran shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 is reinstated if it is revoked.
- 27. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacist License No. RPH 45895 issued to Duyen Tran, Duyen Tran shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacist License Number RPH 45895 is placed on probation or until Pharmacist License Number RPH 45895 is reinstated if it is revoked.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

- 1. Revoking or suspending Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841, issued to Pharmacy 9;
- 2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 45895, issued to Duyen Thi Tran;
- 3. Prohibiting Pharmacy 9. from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 40841 is reinstated if Pharmacy Permit Number 40841 issued to Pharmacy 9 is revoked;
- 4. Prohibiting Julie Tran from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number
