On or about November 10, 2008, the Board issued Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 49371 to Long's Drugs California, LLC dba CVS Pharmacy #9919 (Respondent). The Pharmacy Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 6741 and will expire on November 1, 2020, unless renewed.

JURISDICTION

4. Accusation No. 6741 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs and is currently pending against Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent on November 5, 2019. Respondent timely filed its Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 6741 is attached as exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 6741. Respondent has also carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval.
- 6. Respondent is fully aware of its legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel at its own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on its own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

CULPABILITY

8. Respondent understands and agrees that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 6741, if proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon its Pharmacy Permit.

- 9. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual basis for the charges in the Accusation, and that Respondent hereby gives up its right to contest those charges.
- 10. Respondent agrees that its Pharmacy Permit is subject to discipline and they agree to be bound by the Disciplinary Order below.

CONTINGENCY

- 11. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent or its counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that they may not withdraw its agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 12. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 13. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

The Board of Pharmacy expresses its disapproval specifically for the issues underlying this case; to wit, Respondent's management and treatment of "floating" licensed staff members, both pharmacist and pharmacy technician, and Respondent's lack of oversight and supervision of such staff that allowed such thefts to be possible.

Cost Recovery. Respondent shall pay \$3,925.00 to the Board for its costs associated with the investigation and enforcement of this matter. STATEMENT OF FACTS

- 17. On or about August 10, 2018, the Board received notification from CVS Health¹ that an investigation into employee drug diversion revealed that Nathan Lytle-Pinhey² a "floating" Pharmacy Technician who worked at various CVS Pharmacies on an "as needed" basis, admitted to diverting for self-use about 850 pills of carisoprodol 350 mg from Respondent and other CVS pharmacies he floated at. Included in the notification was Respondent's Report of Theft or Loss of Controlled Substances (DEA Form 106), which revealed a loss of 367 tablets of carisoprodol 350 mg ("drug loss").
- 18. On or about September 28, 2018, a Board Inspector conducted an investigation into Respondent's drug loss. The Inspector reviewed Respondent's audit documents of the drug loss between May 1, 2017 and August 13, 2018, and considered the August 21, 2018 statement from CVS District Leader M. Fretz that a thorough search of Respondent's physical inventory, waiting bin, drug movement reports, and invoices could not explain the drug loss. As a result, the investigation found that Respondent failed to adequately secure its drug stock, a violation of pharmacy law.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Secure and Maintain Pharmacy Facilities)

19. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o), in conjunction with California Code of Regulations title 16, section 1714, subdivision (b), in that Respondent failed to maintain its facilities, space, fixtures, and equipment so that drugs in its stock were safely maintained and secured. An investigation, subsequent to a report of

² In an investigation into the drug losses, CVS Pharmacy Technician Nathan Lytle-Pinhey admitted to CVS District Asset Protection Leader, C.M., that while working as a Pharmacy Technician at various CVS Pharmacies, he diverted 850 tablets of carisoprodol 350mg for selfuse from CVS Pharmacies in Riverbank and in Turlock for approximately 6-7 months prior to July 2018. He also admitted that he was able to divert the drugs in his pockets and bags at CVS Pharmacy #2994 in Turlock and CVS Pharmacy #3079 in Riverbank, due to "chaotic stores/work environments", "pharmacies being very busy", and at pharmacies that were "2-3 days behind in workload". At the conclusion of the investigation, he was terminated from CVS. Pursuant to a stipulation with the Board, he has since surrendered his pharmacy technician license (TCH 37626).

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employee diversion, found that between May 1, 2017 and August 13, 2018, Respondent failed to secure and maintain pharmacy facilities from diversion, theft, or other lapses which resulted in the drug loss set forth in paragraphs 17-18.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Failure to Maintain Accurate Inventory of Dangerous Drugs and Controlled Substances)

20. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o), in conjunction with Code sections 4081, subdivision (a), and 4105, in that it failed to maintain an accurate inventory of dangerous drugs and controlled substances. Specifically, during the above-mentioned investigation, Respondent provided a final reconciliation of the drug loss, which revealed a lesser amount in stock than was accounted for by records required by law, as set forth in paragraphs 17-18.

MATTERS IN AGGRAVATION

- 21. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent, Complainant alleges:
- a. On or about November 16, 2017, the Board issued Citation Number CI 2016 73830³ to Respondent for a violation of CCR, Title 16, Section 1707.2 subdivision (b)(1)(B)⁴ (Failure to Provide Oral Consultation To Patient On New Prescription).
- b. On or about November 20, 2015, the Board issued a Citation and Fine Number CI 2013 60970⁵ to Respondent for violations of CCR title 16, section 1764/Civil Code section 56.10 subdivision (a)⁶ (\$500 Fine) (Unauthorized Disclosure of Prescription and Medical Information), and Business & Professions Code section 4081, subdivision (a)/CCR title 16, section 1718⁷ (\$2,500 Fine) (Failure to Maintain Records).

OTHER MATTERS 1 22. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Permit Number 2 PHY 54149 to Longs Drug Stores California, to do business as CVS Pharmacy # 09919, Longs 3 Drug Stores California shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, 4 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Original Permit 5 Number PHY 49371 is placed on probation or until Original Permit Number PHY 49371 is 6 reinstated if it is revoked. 7 **PRAYER** 8 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, 9 and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision: 10 Revoking or suspending Original Permit Number PHY 49371, issued to Longs Drug 11 Stores California, to do business as CVS Pharmacy # 09919; 12 2. Prohibiting Longs Drug Stores California from serving as a manager, administrator, 13 owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Original 14 Permit Number PHY 49371 is placed on probation or until Original Permit Number PHY 49371 15 is reinstated if Original Permit Number PHY 49371 issued to Longs Drug Stores California is 16 revoked; 17 3. Ordering Respondent to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the 18 investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 19 125.3; and 20 21 4.
