**STIPULATED SETTLEMENT AND**  
**DISCIPLINARY ORDER FOR PUBLIC**  
**REPROVAL**

**[Bus. & Prof. Code § 495]**

24 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-  
25 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

26 **PARTIES**

27 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy  
28 (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by

1 Xavier Becerra, Attorney General of the State of California, by Timothy Froehle, Deputy  
2 Attorney General.

3 2. Respondents Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III, Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust and  
4 Raymond Paul Jajeh, Owners and Raymond Paul Jajeh (Respondent Jeje) are represented in this  
5 proceeding by attorney Anne Marchant of Klein, Hockel, Iezza & Patel, P.C., 1981 North  
6 Broadway, Suite 220, Walnut Creek, CA 94596.

7 **JURISDICTION**

8 3. On or about January 30, 2009, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Permit  
9 Number PHY 48787 to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III with Raymond Paul Jajeh designated as  
10 Pharmacist in Charge since November 1, 2014, as well as President and 49-percent shareholder  
11 since April 3, 2015, and with Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust as 51-percent shareholder since  
12 April 3, 2015 (Respondent Pharmacy). The Original Permit was in full force and effect at all  
13 times relevant to the charges brought here and will expire on January 1, 2021, unless renewed.

14 4. On or about August 5, 1994, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License  
15 Number RPH 47418 to Respondent Jajeh. The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at  
16 all times relevant to the charges brought here and will expire on March 31, 2022, unless renewed.

17 5. Second Amended Accusation No. 6819 was filed before the Board of Pharmacy  
18 (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs and is currently pending against Respondents. The  
19 Second Amended Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served  
20 on Respondents on December 13, 2019. Respondents timely filed their Notice of Defense  
21 contesting the Second Amended Accusation. A copy of Second Amended Accusation No. 6819  
22 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated here by reference.

23 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

24 6. Respondents have carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the  
25 charges and allegations in Second Amended Accusation No. 6819. Respondents have also  
26 carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated  
27 Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reapproval.

28 ///

7. Respondents are fully aware of its legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Second Amended Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel at its own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on its own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

8. Respondents voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waive and give up each and every right set forth above.

## CULPABILITY

9. Respondents understand and agree that the charges and allegations in Scond Amended Accusation No. 6819, if proven at hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon their Original Permit and Pharmacist License, respectively.

10. For the purpose of resolving Second Amended Accusation No. 6819 with the expense and uncertainty of further proceedings, Respondents hereby give up their rights to contest those charges and allegations in Second Amended Accusation No. 6819.

11. Respondents agree that their Original Permit and Pharmacist License, respectively, is subject to discipline and they agree to be bound by the Disciplinary Order below.

12. Respondents agree that in any future disciplinary proceeding before the Board against Respondent the allegations set forth in Second Amended Accusation No. 6819 shall be deemed admitted.

## RESERVATIONS

13. The admissions made by Respondents here are only for the purposes of this proceeding or any other proceedings in which the Board of Pharmacy, or other professional licensing agency, is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or civil proceeding.

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**CONTINGENCY**

14. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondents understand and agree that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondents or their counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondents understand and agree that they may not withdraw their agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

15. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval, including Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

16. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

17. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Disciplinary Order:

**DISCIPLINARY ORDER**

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Original Permit No. PHY 48787, issued to Respondent Pharmacy, and Pharmacist License No. RPH 47418, issued to Respondent Jajeh, shall be publicly

1 reproved by the Board of Pharmacy under Business and Professions Code section 495 in  
2 resolution of Second Accusation No. 6819, attached as Exhibit A. This decision constitutes a  
3 record of discipline and shall become a part of Respondents' license history with the Board.

4 **Cost Recovery.** Respondents shall pay \$5,761.50 to the Board for its costs associated with  
5 the investigation and enforcement of this matter. Respondents shall be permitted to pay these  
6 costs in a payment plan approved by the Board. If Respondents fail to pay the Board costs as  
7 ordered, Respondents shall not be allowed to renew their Original Permit or Pharmacist license  
8 until Respondents pay costs in full.

9 **Full Compliance.** As a resolution of the charges in Second Accusation No. 6819, this  
10 stipulated settlement is contingent upon Respondents' full compliance with all conditions of this  
11 Order. If Respondents fail to satisfy any of these conditions, such failure to comply constitutes  
12 cause for discipline, including outright revocation, of Respondent Pharmacy's Original Permit  
13 No. PHY 48787 and Respondent Jajeh's Pharmacist License No. RPH 47418.

14 **ACCEPTANCE**

15 I have carefully read the above Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public  
16 Reproval and have fully discussed it with my attorney, Anne Marchant. I understand the  
17 stipulation and the effect it will have on my Original Permit. I enter into this Stipulated  
18 Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently,  
19 and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board of Pharmacy.



24 **PARTIES**

25 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) brings this Second Amended Accusation solely in her  
26 official capacity as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer  
27 Affairs.  
28

2. On or about January 30, 2009, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Permit Number PHY 48787 to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III with Raymond Paul Jajeh designated as Pharmacist in Charge since November 1, 2014, as well as President and 49-percent shareholder since April 3, 2015, and with Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust as 51-percent shareholder since April 3, 2015 (Respondent Pharmacy). The Original Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought here and will expire on January 1, 2021, unless renewed.

3. On or about August 5, 1994, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License Number RPH 47418 to Raymond Paul Jajeh (Respondent Jajeh). The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought here and will expire on March 31, 2020, unless renewed.

### **JURISDICTION**

4. This Second Amended Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

5. Section 4113, subdivision (c), of the Code, states, in pertinent part:

“(c) The pharmacist-in-charge shall be responsible for a pharmacy’s compliance with all state and federal laws and regulations pertaining to the practice of pharmacy.”

6. Section 4300, subdivision (a), of the Code provides that every license issued by the Board may be suspended or revoked.

7. Section 4300.1 of the Code states:

“The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.”

8. Section 4307, subdivision (a), of the Code states:

“Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who

1 has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any  
2 other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or  
3 association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has  
4 been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member,  
5 officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had  
6 knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied,  
7 revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager,  
8 administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with  
9 management or control of a licensee as follows:

10 “(1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on  
11 probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.

12 “(2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license  
13 is issued or reinstated.”

#### 14 **STATUTORY PROVISIONS**

15 9. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part:

16 “The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional  
17 conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is  
18 not limited to, any of the following:

19 . . .

20 “(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or  
21 abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the  
22 applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations  
23 established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

24 . . .”

#### 25 **REGULATORY PROVISIONS**

26 10. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1707.3, states:  
27  
28

1 “Prior to consultation as set forth in section 1707.2, a pharmacist shall review a patient's  
2 drug therapy and medication record before each prescription drug is delivered. The review shall  
3 include screening for severe potential drug therapy problems.”

4 11. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1716, states:

5 “Pharmacists shall not deviate from the requirements of a prescription except upon the prior  
6 consent of the prescriber or to select the drug product in accordance with Section 4073 of the  
7 Business and Professions Code.

8 “Nothing in this regulation is intended to prohibit a pharmacist from exercising commonly-  
9 accepted pharmaceutical practice in the compounding or dispensing of a prescription.”

10 12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1735.2, subdivision (i), states, in  
11 pertinent part:

12 “(i) Every compounded drug preparation shall be given a beyond use date representing the  
13 date or date and time beyond which the compounded drug preparation should not be used, stored,  
14 transported or administered, and determined based on the professional judgment of the pharmacist  
15 performing or supervising the compounding.

16 (1) For non-sterile compounded drug preparation(s), the beyond use date shall not  
17 exceed any of the following:

18 (A) the shortest expiration date or beyond use date of any ingredient in the  
19 compounded drug preparation,

20 . . .”

## 21 **COST RECOVERY**

22 13. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the  
23 administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of  
24 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and  
25 enforcement of the case.

## 26 **DEFINITIONS**

27 14. Warfarin, also known by the brand name Coumadin, is a dangerous drug under  
28 Business and Professions Code section 4022. It is used as a blood thinner.

1 **FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

2 **(Variation from Prescription)**

3 15. Respondent Pharmacy has subjected its pharmacy permit to discipline, and  
4 Respondent Jajeh has subjected his pharmacist license to discipline, because Respondents  
5 deviated from the requirements of a prescription. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4301, subd. (o); Cal.  
6 Code Regs., tit. 16, §§ 1707.3, 1716.) Respondent Jajeh is responsible as pharmacist in charge.  
7 (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4113, subd. (c).) The circumstances are as follows:

8 16. On or about September 4, 2018, a pharmacist working for Respondent Pharmacy  
9 verified and dispensed a prescription incorrectly to patient M.S. The prescription was written for  
10 Coumadin 5 mg, but the pharmacy staff typed and dispensed warfarin 1 mg tablets. This caused  
11 patient M.S. to ingest the wrong medication for approximately 20 days.

12 17. Additionally, in filling the prescription, Respondent Pharmacy's pharmacist failed to  
13 review patient M.S.'s drug therapy and medication records, which indicated that M.S. had been  
14 taking Coumadin 5 mg tablets since January 2016.

15 **SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

16 **(Compounding Limitations and Requirements)**

17 18. Respondent Pharmacy has subjected its pharmacy permit to discipline, and  
18 Respondent Jajeh has subjected his pharmacist license to discipline, because Respondents  
19 assigned beyond-use dates on compounded drug preparations that exceeded the expiration dates  
20 of the ingredients used to prepare the product. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4301, subd. (o); Cal. Code  
21 Regs., tit. 16, §§ 1735.2, subd. (i)(1)(A).) Respondent Jajeh is responsible as pharmacist in  
22 charge. (Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4113, subd. (c).) The circumstances are as follows:

23 19. On or about December 13, 2018, during a routine inspection of Respondent  
24 Pharmacy, the Board's inspector reviewed Respondents' compounding records. The inspector  
25 found that multiple records of compounded drug preparations prepared between November 1,  
26 2018, and December 13, 2018, were assigned beyond-use dates to the finished product that  
27 exceeded the shortest beyond-use date of the ingredients used in the preparation.

28 ///

1 **OTHER MATTERS**

2 20. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Permit Number  
3 PHY 48787, issued to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III, Jajco Inc. shall be prohibited from serving  
4 as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee  
5 for five years if Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is placed on probation or until Original  
6 Permit Number PHY 48787 is reinstated if it is revoked.

7 21. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Permit Number  
8 PHY 48787, issued to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III, while Respondent Jajeh and/or the  
9 Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust have been owner and had knowledge of or knowingly  
10 participated in any conduct for which the licensee was disciplined, Respondent Jajeh and/or  
11 persons with management or control of Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust shall be prohibited from  
12 serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a  
13 licensee for five years if Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is placed on probation or until  
14 Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is reinstated if it is revoked.

15 **DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS**

16 22. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent  
17 Pharmacy, Complainant alleges that on or about March 6, 2017, in a prior action, the Board of  
18 Pharmacy issued Citation Number CI 2016 74345 to Respondent Pharmacy. That Citation is now  
19 final.

20 23. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Jajeh,  
21 Complainant alleges that on or about March 6, 2017, in a prior action, the Board of Pharmacy  
22 issued Citation Number CI 2016 74346, requiring Respondent Jajeh to pay a fine of \$2,500.00.  
23 That Citation is now final.

24 **PRAYER**

25 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged, and  
26 that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

27 1. Revoking or suspending Original Permit Number PHY 48787, issued to Jajco Inc.  
28 dba Anchor Drugs III;



2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 47418, issued to Raymond Paul Jajeh;

3. Prohibiting Jajco Inc. from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is placed on probation or until Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is reinstated if Original Permit Number 48787 issued to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III is revoked.

4. Prohibiting Raymond Paul Jajeh from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is placed on probation or until Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is reinstated if Original Permit Number 48787 issued to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III is revoked.

5. Prohibiting the Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust and any persons with management or control of Kanaan Paul Jajeh Family Trust from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is placed on probation or until Original Permit Number PHY 48787 is reinstated if Original Permit Number 48787 issued to Jajco Inc. dba Anchor Drugs III is revoked.

6. Ordering Jajco Inc. and Raymond Paul Jajeh to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,

7. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
