20 21		ant Anne Sodergren, in her official capacity as		
22	the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs, filed			
23	Accusation No. 6950 against Robert Henry Cowgill (Respondent) before the Board of Pharmacy.			
24	(Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)			
25	2. On or about November 5, 2018, the Board of Pharmacy (Board) issued Pharmacy			
26	Technician Registration No. TCH 168710 to Respondent. The Pharmacy Technician Registration			
27	was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 6950			
28	and will expire on April 30, 2022, unless renewed.			
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- 3. On or about July 27, 2020, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 6950, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is: 5602 Halifax Rd, Arcadia, CA 91007.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505(c) and/or Business and Professions Code section 124.
 - 5. Government Code section 11506(c) states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense . . . shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 6. The Board takes official notice of its records and the fact that Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon him of the Accusation, and therefore waived his right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 6950.
 - 7. California Government Code section 11520(a) states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense . . . or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent...
- 8. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this matter, as well as taking official notice of all the investigatory reports, exhibits and statements contained therein on file at the Board's offices regarding the allegations contained in Accusation No. 6950, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 6950, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.

9. The Board finds that the actual costs for Investigation and Enforcement are \$2,940.00 as of September 9, 2020.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES

- 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Robert Henry Cowgill has subjected his Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 168710 to discipline.
 - 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
- 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case:
- a. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Business and Professions Code section 4301, subsection (h) in that on October 26, 2019, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct by ingesting cocaine, which is a controlled substance, to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, any other person or public; and
- b. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subsection (j), in that Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct by violating statutes regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs. Specifically, Respondent violated California Health and Safety Code Section 11350 [Possession of a Controlled Substance – Cocaine], California Health and Safety Code section 11370.1(a) [Possession of Narcotics with Firearm], California Health and Safety Code section 11550(a) [Under the Influence of a Controlled Substance], and Health and Safety Code section 11359(b) [Possession for Sales of Marijuana].

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IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 168710, issued to Respondent Robert Henry Cowgill, is revoked.

ORDER

Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. The agency in its discretion may

	vacate the Decision and grant a hearing on a showing of good cause, as defined in the statute.

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Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), or (20) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, or specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in subdivision (h) of Section 11056, or (2) any controlled substance classified in Schedule III, IV, or V which is a narcotic drug, unless upon the written prescription of a physician, dentist, podiatrist, or veterinarian licensed to practice in this state, shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for not more than one year, except that such person shall instead be punished pursuant to subdivision (h) of Section 1170 of the Penal Code if that person has one or more prior convictions for an offense specified in clause (iv) of subparagraph (C) of paragraph (2) of subdivision (e) of Section 667 of the Penal Code or for an offense requiring registration pursuant to subdivision (c) of Section 290 of the Penal Code.

- 8. California Health and Safety Code section 11370.1, subsection (a), states:
- (a) Notwithstanding Section 11350 or 11377 or any other provision of law, every person who unlawfully possesses any amount of a substance containing cocaine base, a substance containing cocaine, a substance containing heroin, a substance containing methamphetamine, a crystalline substance containing phencyclidine, a liquid substance containing phencyclidine, plant material containing phencyclidine, or a hand-rolled cigarette treated with phencyclidine while armed with a loaded, operable firearm is guilty of a felony punishable by imprisonment in the state prison for two, three, or four years.
 - 9. California Health and Safety Code section 11550, subsection (a), states:
- (a) A person shall not use, or be under the influence of any controlled substance that is (1) specified in subdivision (b), (c), or (e), or paragraph (1) of subdivision (f) of Section 11054, specified in paragraph (14), (15), (21), (22), or (23) of subdivision (d) of Section 11054, specified in subdivision (b) or (c) of Section 11055, or specified in paragraph (1) or (2) of subdivision (d) or in paragraph (3) of subdivision (e) of Section 11055, or (2) a narcotic drug classified in Schedule III, IV, or V, except when administered by or under the direction of a person licensed by the state to dispense, prescribe, or administer controlled substances. It shall be the burden of the defense to show that it comes within the exception. A person convicted of violating this subdivision is guilty of a misdemeanor and shall be sentenced to serve a term of not more than

one year in a county jail. The court may also place a person convicted under this subdivision on probation for a period not to exceed five years.

10. California Health and Safety Code section 11359, subsection (b), states:

Every person who possesses for sale any cannabis, except as otherwise provided by law, shall be punished as follows:

. . .

(b) Every person 18 years of age or over who possesses cannabis for sale shall be punished by imprisonment in a county jail for a period of not more than six months or by a fine of not more than five hundred dollars (\$500), or by both such fine and imprisonment.

COST RECOVERY

11. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

CONTROLLED SUBSTANCES

- 12. Cocaine is classified as a Schedule II controlled substance under California Health and Safety Code section 11055, subsection (b)(6).
- 13. Cannabis is classified as a Schedule I controlled substance under California Health and Safety Code section 11054, subsection (d)(13).

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- 14. On or about October 26, 2019, officers from the Los Angeles County Sheriff's Department were called to Respondent's residence for suspected robbery. Upon arrival, one of the officers spoke with Respondent, who stated that he grabbed his handgun and fired a round into the air while arguing with his friend regarding money that had gone missing. While speaking with the officer, Respondent displayed signs and symptoms of someone being under the influence of a controlled substance, including but not limited to rapid fidgety hand movements.
- 15. After speaking with Respondent, the officers entered Respondent's residence and observed an unloaded firearm, a magazine with four bullets loaded, and a large plastic bag

containing marijuana, more than 28.5 grams, sitting in plain view. After Respondent realized that the officers had observed the bag of marijuana, he stated, "Yeah, that's my bag of marijuana."

- 16. Respondent also opened and showed his canvas bag to the officers, which contained two separate large amounts of U.S. currency wrapped with rubber bands, other large amounts of loose U.S. currency, and two digital scales with one scale containing a green leafy substance resembling marijuana residue. The officers formed the opinion that Respondent was in possession of marijuana for sale and arrested Respondent.
- 17. Subsequent to the arrest, an officer searched Respondent and recovered two plastic bags containing a white powdery substance resembling cocaine from Respondent's front left pant pocket. While transporting Respondent to the police station, Respondent stated that prior to the officers' arrival, he ingested cocaine by snorting to calm his nerves. When an officer asked Respondent about the contents of the two plastic bags from his left pant pocket, Respondent replied, "That's cocaine. For personal use."
- 18. Respondent was arrested for violating California Health and Safety Code section 11370.1(a) [Possession of Narcotics with Firearm], California Health and Safety Code section 11550(a) [Under the Influence of a Controlled Substance], and Health and Safety Code section 11359(b) [Possession for Sales of Marijuana].

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Use of Controlled Substance)

19. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subsection (h) in that on October 26, 2019, Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct by ingesting cocaine, which is a controlled substance, to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, any other person or public. Paragraphs 12 to 18 are re-alleged as if fully set forth herein.

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Violation of California Health and Safety Code)

20. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subsection (j), in that Respondent engaged in unprofessional conduct by violating statutes regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs. Specifically, Respondent violated California Health and Safety

10	issued to Robert Henry Cowgill;		
11	2. Ordering Robert Henry Cowgill to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of		
12	the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section		
13	125.3; and,		
14	3. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
