1 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between parties to the above-
2 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

3 **PARTIES**

4 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy
5 (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by
6 Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Aspasia A. Papavassiliou, Deputy
7 Attorney General.

8 2. Lisa K. Harb, owner of Bacon East Pharmacy (Respondent), is represented in this
9 proceeding by attorney Ivan Petrzelka, whose address is: Gemini Law, P.O. Box 552,
10 Red Bluff, CA 96080-0552.

11 3. On or about April 16, 2015, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacy Permit
12 Number PHY 53596 to Respondent. The permit expired due to a change in location on March 4,
13 2019, and has not been renewed.

14 4. On or about March 4, 2019, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacy Permit
15 Number PHY 57144 to Respondent. The permit was canceled due to a discontinuance of
16 business on May 27, 2020, and remains canceled.

17 **JURISDICTION**

18 5. Accusation No. 7007 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against
19 Respondent. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served
20 on Respondent on February 2, 2021. Respondent timely filed a Notice of Defense contesting the
21 Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 7007 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by
22 reference.

23 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

24 6. Respondent has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the
25 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7007. Respondent also has carefully read, fully
26 discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and
27 Order.

1 7. Respondent is fully aware of Respondent’s legal rights in this matter, including the
2 right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-
3 examine the witnesses against Respondent; the right to present evidence and to testify on
4 Respondent’s own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of
5 witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an
6 adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act
7 and other applicable laws.

8 8. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and
9 every right set forth above.

10 **CULPABILITY**

11 9. Respondent understands that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7007, if
12 proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon Respondent’s Original
13 Pharmacy Permits.

14 10. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of
15 further proceedings, Respondent agrees that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual
16 basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline.
17 Respondent hereby gives up the right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those
18 charges.

19 11. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation Respondent enables the Board
20 to issue an order accepting the surrender of Respondent’s Original Pharmacy Permits without
21 further process.

22 **RESERVATION**

23 12. The admissions made by Respondent in this stipulation are only for the purposes of
24 this proceeding, or any other proceedings in which the Board of Pharmacy or other professional
25 licensing agency is involved, and shall not be admissible in any other criminal or civil
26 proceeding.

27 **CONTINGENCY**

28 13. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands

1 and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly
2 with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by
3 Respondent or Respondent's counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and
4 agrees that Respondent may not withdraw Respondent's agreement or seek to rescind the
5 stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this
6 stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of
7 no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between
8 the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this
9 matter.

10 14. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
11 copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures
12 thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

13 15. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
14 integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
15 It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
16 negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order
17 may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
18 executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

19 16. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
20 the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

21 **ORDER**

22 IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Original Pharmacy Permits No. PHY 53596 and No. PHY
23 57144, issued to Lisa K. Harb as owner of Bacon East Pharmacy (Respondent), are surrendered
24 and accepted by the Board.

25 1. The surrender of Respondent's Original Pharmacy Permits and the acceptance of the
26 surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondent.
27 This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondent's
28 license history with the Board.

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2. Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges to operate a pharmacy in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3. On or before the effective date of the Decision and Order, Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board any pocket license(s) and wall certificate(s) issued to Respondent.

4. If Lisa K Harb ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Lisa K. Harb must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 7007 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Lisa K. Harb when the Board determines whether to grant or deny the application or petition.

5. If Respondents Bacon East Pharmacy should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 7007 shall be deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondents Bacon East Pharmacy for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

6. Respondent shall not apply to the Board for licensure or petition for reinstatement for at least three years after the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

ACCEPTANCE

I have carefully read the above Stipulated Surrender of License and Order and have fully discussed it with my attorney Ivan Petrzelka. I understand the stipulation and the effect it will have on my Original Pharmacy Permits. I enter into this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently, and agree to be bound by the Decision and Order of the Board of Pharmacy.

1 **PARTIES**

2 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity
3 as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.

4 2. On or about April 16, 2015, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacy Permit
5 Number PHY 53596 to Bacon East Pharmacy (Respondent Bacon East I), with Lisa K. Harb as
6 the Owner. The permit expired due to a change in location on March 4, 2019, and has not been
7 renewed.

8 3. On or about March 4, 2019, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacy Permit
9 Number PHY 57144 to Bacon East Pharmacy (Respondent Bacon East II), with Lisa K. Harb as
10 the Owner. The permit was canceled due to a discontinuance of business on May 27, 2020, and
11 remains canceled.

12 4. On or about July 1, 2016, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacy Permit
13 Number PHY 54552 to Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy (Respondent Reliable Rexall Sunset),
14 with Sean Brian Weekes and William Mostyn Steele as the Owners. The permit was in full force
15 and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in this Accusation and will expire on July 1,
16 2021, unless renewed.

17 5. On or about October 18, 2013, the Board of Pharmacy issued Original Pharmacist
18 License Number RPH 70114 to Sean Brian Weekes (Respondent Weekes). The Original
19 Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in this
20 Accusation and will expire on July 31, 2021, unless renewed.

21 6. Respondent Weekes was Pharmacist-in-Charge (PIC) of Respondent Bacon East I
22 from April 16, 2015, to March 4, 2019, and of Bacon East II from March 4, 2019, to March 24,
23 2020. In addition, Respondent Weekes has been PIC of Respondent Reliable Rexall Sunset since
24 July 1, 2016.

25 **JURISDICTION**

26 7. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of
27 Consumer Affairs, under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the
28 Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

1 (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until
2 the license is issued or reinstated.

3 (b) “Manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate,
4 partner, or any other person with management or control of a license” as used in this
5 section and Section 4308, may refer to a pharmacist or to any other person who serves
6 in such capacity in or for a licensee.

7 (c) The provisions of subdivision (a) may be alleged in any pleading filed
8 pursuant to Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of
9 the Government Code. However, no order may be issued in that case except as to a
10 person who is named in the caption, as to whom the pleading alleges the applicability
11 of this section, and where the person has been given notice of the proceeding as
12 required by Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of
13 the Government Code. The authority to proceed as provided by this subdivision
14 shall be in addition to the board's authority to proceed under Section 4339 or any
15 other provision of law.

16 12. Section 4081, subdivision (a) of the Code states:

17 All records of manufacture and of sale, acquisition, or disposition of dangerous
18 drugs or dangerous devices shall be at all times during business hours open to
19 inspection by authorized officers of the law, and shall be preserved for at least three
20 years from the date of making. A current inventory shall be kept by every
21 manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacy, veterinary food-animal drug retailer, physician,
22 dentist, podiatrist, veterinarian, laboratory, clinic, hospital, institution, or
23 establishment holding a currently valid and unrevoked certificate, license, permit,
24 registration, or exemption under Division 2 (commencing with Section 1200) of the
25 Health and Safety Code or under Part 4 (commencing with Section 16000) of
26 Division 9 of the Welfare and Institutions Code who maintains a stock of dangerous
27 drugs or dangerous devices.

17 **REGULATORY PROVISIONS**

18 13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1714, subdivision (b), states:

19 Each pharmacy licensed by the board shall maintain its facilities, space,
20 fixtures, and equipment so that drugs are safely and properly prepared, maintained,
21 secured and distributed. The pharmacy shall be of sufficient size and unobstructed
22 area to accommodate the safe practice of pharmacy.

23 14. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1718, states:

24 “Current Inventory” as used in Sections 4081 and 4332 of the Business and
25 Professions Code shall be considered to include complete accountability for all
26 dangerous drugs handled by every licensee enumerated in Sections 4081 and 4332.

27 The controlled substances inventories required by Title 21, CFR, Section 1304
28 shall be available for inspection upon request for at least 3 years after the date of the
inventory.

1 **COST RECOVERY**

2 15. Section 125.3 of the Code states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the
3 administrative law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of
4 the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and
5 enforcement of the case.

6 **DRUGS**

7 16. Invega is a brand name of paliperidone palmitate, an antipsychotic medication that is
8 a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

9 17. Abilify is a brand name of aripiprazole, an antipsychotic medication that is a
10 dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

11 18. Suboxone is a brand name of buprenorphine/naloxone, an opioid agonist/antagonist
12 medication that is a dangerous drug dangerous drug under Code section 4022 and a Schedule III
13 controlled substance under Health and Safety Code section 11056.

14 19. Truvada is a brand name of emtricitabine/tenofovir disoproxil fumarate, an antiviral
15 medication that is a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

16 20. Nexium is a brand name of esomeprazole, a medication used to treat
17 gastroesophageal disease, and is a dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

18 21. Flovent is a brand name of fluticasone, a medication used to treat asthma, and is a
19 dangerous drug under Code section 4022.

20 **FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS**

21 22. On or about March 27, 2020, an attorney for Respondent Bacon East II notified the
22 Board that Respondent Weekes had been terminated on suspicion of diverting dangerous drugs.
23 The subsequent Board investigation revealed that Respondents Bacon East I and Bacon East II
24 purchased large amounts of expensive drugs that they did not dispense, while Respondent
25 Reliable Rexall Sunset, which was half-owned by Respondent Weekes, dispensed more of those
26 same drugs than purchased. Respondents were unable to account for the overage or underage
27 except Respondents Bacon East I and Bacon East II alleged that Respondent Weekes diverted
28 drugs from Bacon East Pharmacy in order to sell at Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy.

1 23. A Board verification audit of acquisition and disposition records of Respondents
2 Bacon East I and Bacon East II for the period of January 1, 2019, to March 18, 2020, failed to
3 account for an overage of 244 tablets of buprenorphine/naloxone 8mg/2mg tablets. The audit also
4 showed a shortage of the following drugs: 29 Invega Sustenna 234mg/1.5ml syringes; 16 Abilify
5 Maintena 400mg syringes; 330 Truvada 200/300mg tablets; 9 Invega Sustenna 117mg/.75ml
6 syringes; 9 Abilify Maintena 300mg syringes; and 7 Invega Sustenna 78mg/0.5ml syringes.
7 Respondents Bacon East I and Bacon East II purchased more of these drugs than they sold yet the
8 drugs could not be found in the pharmacy inventory. The estimated loss of the missing drugs was
9 \$155,561.87.

10 24. A subsequent Board audit of Respondent Reliable Rexall Sunset for the period from
11 May 20, 2017, to May 20, 2020, revealed the loss of 270 buprenorphine/naloxone 8mg/2mg
12 tablets but an overage of the following dangerous drugs: 60 Invega Sustenna 234mg/L5ml
13 syringes; 42 Abilify Maintena 400mg syringes; 4,105 Truvada 200/300mg tablets; 24 Invega
14 Sustenna 117mg/.75ml syringes; 19 Abilify Maintena 300mg syringes and 12 Invega Sustenna
15 78mg/0.5ml syringes.

16 FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

17 **(Records of Dangerous Drugs; Maintenance of Records)**

18 25. Respondents Bacon East I, Bacon East II, and Reliable Rexall Sunset have subjected
19 their pharmacy permits to discipline and Respondent Weekes has subjected his pharmacist permit
20 to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o), in that they
21 violated a law regarding dangerous drugs and a law or regulation regarding the practice of
22 pharmacy. Specifically, Respondents violated section 4081, subdivision (a), and California Code
23 of Regulations, title 16, section 1718, regarding maintenance of records regarding dangerous
24 drugs. As set forth in paragraphs 22-24, above, Respondents' records failed to account for a loss
25 of dangerous drugs or the overage of other dangerous drugs.

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1 **SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

2 **(Operational Standards and Security)**

3 26. Respondents Bacon East I, Bacon East II, and Reliable Rexall Sunset have subjected
4 their pharmacy permits to discipline and Respondent Weekes has subjected his pharmacist license
5 to discipline for unprofessional conduct under Code section 4301, subdivision (o), in that they
6 violated a regulation regarding pharmacy practice. Specifically, Respondents violated California
7 Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1718, regarding operational standards and security. As set
8 forth in paragraphs 22-24 above, Respondents failed to maintain the security of their dangerous
9 drugs inventory.

10 **DISCIPLINARY CONSIDERATIONS**

11 27. Complainant further alleges, as disciplinary considerations, that Respondent Bacon
12 East I and Respondent Weekes were subject prior disciplinary and administrative actions, as
13 described below.

14 **Public Reprovals**

15 28. Effective July 13, 2017, following adoption of stipulated settlements in resolution of
16 the Accusation in Case No. 5890, Respondent Bacon East I and Respondent Weekes were
17 publicly reprovved. The accusation alleged that a phenylephrine solution nasal spray compounded
18 by Respondents on September 22, 2015, was contaminated with the bacteria *Serratia marcescens*,
19 and that Respondents were subject to discipline for using expired ingredients, failing to maintain
20 operational standards, and misbranding the compounded drug with a 180-day expiration date
21 instead of a 30-day expiration date.

22 **Citations**

23 29. On or about April 3, 2018, the Board issued Citation No. CI 2016 74694 to
24 Respondent Bacon East I and Citation No. CI 2017 7936 to Respondent Weekes. Those citations
25 are final and alleged that from April 27, 2015, to November 10, 2015, Respondents'
26 compounding logs were incomplete regarding three prescriptions for progesterone suppositories,
27 in that the logs were missing manufacturer, lot, and expiration date for the polyethylene used to
28 compound the drugs.

OTHER MATTERS

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2 30. Under Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Pharmacy Permit
3 Numbers PHY 53596 or 57144 issued to Bacon East Pharmacy, then Bacon East Pharmacy shall
4 be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director,
5 associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if the permit is placed on probation or until
6 the permit is reinstated if it is revoked.

7 30. Under Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Pharmacy Permit
8 Number 54552 issued to Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy, then Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy
9 shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director,
10 associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if the permit is placed on probation or until
11 the permit is reinstated if it is revoked.

12 31. Under Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Pharmacy Permit
13 Numbers PHY 53596 or 57144, issued to Bacon East Pharmacy, and Lisa K. Harb was an owner
14 and had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the licensee was
15 disciplined, then Lisa K. Harb shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator,
16 owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if the
17 permit is placed on probation or until the permit is reinstated if it is revoked.

18 31. Under Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Pharmacy Permit
19 Number 54552, issued to Respondent Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy, and William Mostyn
20 Steel was an owner and had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the
21 licensee was disciplined, then William Mostyn Steel shall be prohibited from serving as a
22 manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up
23 to five years if the permit is placed on probation or until the permit is reinstated if it is revoked.

24 31. Under Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Original Pharmacy Permit
25 Number 54522, issued to Respondent Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy, and Sean Brian Weekes
26 was an owner and had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the
27 licensee was disciplined, then Sean Brian Weekes shall be prohibited from serving as a manager,
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1 administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five
2 years if the permit is placed on probation or until the permit is reinstated if it is revoked.

3 33. Pursuant to section 4307 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Original Pharmacist
4 License Number 70114 issued to Sean Brian Weekes, then Sean Brian Weekes shall be prohibited
5 from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner
6 of a licensee for up to five years if the pharmacist license is placed on probation or until the
7 pharmacist license is reinstated if it is revoked.

8 **PRAYER**

9 WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters alleged in this
10 Accusation, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

11 1. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 53596, issued to
12 Bacon East Pharmacy;

13 2. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 57144, issued to
14 Bacon East Pharmacy;

15 3. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 54552, issued to
16 Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy;

17 4. Revoking or suspending Original Pharmacist License Number RPH 70114, issued to
18 Sean Brian Weekes;

19 5. Prohibiting Bacon East Pharmacy from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
20 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if its Original
21 Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 53596 or PHY 57244 is placed on probation or until the permit is
22 reinstated if it is revoked;

23 6. Prohibiting Lisa K. Harb from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member,
24 officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if Original Pharmacy
25 Permit Number PHY 53596 or PHY 57244 is placed on probation or until the permit is reinstated
26 if it is revoked.

27 7. Prohibiting Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy from serving as a manager,
28 administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five

1 years if its Original Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 54552 is placed on probation or until the
2 permit is reinstated if it is revoked;

3 8. Prohibiting William Mostyn Steel from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
4 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if Original
5 Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 54552 is placed on probation or until the permit is reinstated if
6 revoked;

7 9. Prohibiting Sean Brian Weekes from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
8 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if Original
9 Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 54552 is placed on probation or until the permit is reinstated if
10 revoked;

11 10. Prohibiting Sean Brian Weekes from serving as a manager, administrator, owner,
12 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for up to five years if his Original
13 Pharmacist License number RPH 70114 is placed on probation or until the license is reinstated if
14 revoked;

15 11. Ordering Bacon East Pharmacy, Reliable Rexall Sunset Pharmacy and Sean Brian
16 Weekes to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement
17 of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,

18 12. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
