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IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the aboveentitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

### PARTIES

 Anne Sodergren (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Thomas L. Rinaldi, Supervising Deputy Attorney General.

Emerson Pharmacy, Inc. dba Loyola Pharmacy; Nima Rodefshalom, Joseph Kohan,
 Mehran Kohan-Bash (Respondent LP1), Emerson Pharmacy, Inc. dba Loyola Pharmacy, Nima
 Rodefshalom, Joseph Kohan, Mehran Kohan-Bash (Respondent LP2), Nima Rodefshalom
 (Respondent Rodefshalom) and MehranKohan-Bash (Respondent Mehran Kohan-Bash) are
 represented in this proceeding by attorney Herbert L. Weinberg, whose address is: 1990 South
 Bundy Drive, Suite 777, Los Angeles, CA 90025

On or about June 24, 2015, the Board issued Permit No. PHY 53692 to Respondent
 LP1, with Respondent Rodefshalom designated as the President and 50 % shareholder from June
 24, 2015 to August 10, 2018, Respondent Kohan designated as Chief Financial Officer and 25%
 shareholder from November 14, 2007 to August 10, 2018, and Respondent Kohan-Bash
 designated as Secretary and 25 % shareholder from June 24, 2015 to August 10, 2018. The
 Permit expired on August 10, 2018, and has not been renewed.

4. On or about November 14, 2007, the Board issued Permit No. PHY 48754 to
 Respondent LP2, with Respondent Rodefshalom designated as President and 50 % shareholder
 from November 14, 2007 to July 13, 2015, Respondent Kohan designated as Chief Financial
 Officer and 25 % shareholder from November 14, 2007 to July 13, 2015, and Respondent Kohan Bash designated as Secretary and 25% shareholder from November 14, 2007 to July 13, 2015.
 The Permit expired on July 13, 2015, and has not been renewed.

26 5. On or about August 6, 2004, the Board issued Pharmacist License No. RPH 55990 to
27 Respondent Rodefshalom. The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all

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times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on December 31, 2021, unless 1 2 renewed. 6. On or about August 9, 1991, the Board issued Pharmacist License No. RPH 44499 to 3 Respondent Kohan-Bash. The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times 4 5 relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on December 31, 2022, unless renewed. JURISDICTION 6 7. Accusation No. 7082 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against 7 Respondents. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served 8 9 on Respondents on April 23, 2021. Respondents timely filed a Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 7082 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by 10 reference. 11 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS** 12 Respondents have carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understand the 8. 13 14 charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7082. Respondents also have carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understand the effects of this Stipulated Surrender of License and 15 Order. 16 9. Respondents are fully aware of their legal rights in this matter, including the right to a 17 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to confront and cross-examine 18 19 the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on their own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of 20documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other 21 rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws. 22 10. Respondents voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waive and give up each and 23 24 every right set forth above. **CULPABILITY** 25 Respondents understand that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7082, if 26 11. proven at a hearing, constitute cause for imposing discipline upon Permit No. PHY 53692, 27 28 /// 3

Permit No. PHY 48754, Pharmacist License No. RPH 55990, and Pharmacist License No. RPH 44499.

3 12. For the purpose of resolving the Accusation without the expense and uncertainty of
4 further proceedings, Respondents agree that, at a hearing, Complainant could establish a factual
5 basis for the charges in the Accusation and that those charges constitute cause for discipline.
6 Respondents hereby give up their right to contest that cause for discipline exists based on those
7 charges.

- 8 13. Respondents understand that by signing this stipulation they enable the Board to issue
  9 an order accepting the surrender of Permit No. PHY 53692, Permit No. PHY 48754, Pharmacist
  10 License No. RPH 55990, and Pharmacist License No. RPH 44499 without further process.
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#### **CONTINGENCY**

14. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondents understand 12 and agree that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with 13 14 the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by Respondents or its counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondents understand and agree that 15 they may not withdraw its agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board 16 considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, 17 the Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this 18 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not 19 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter. 20

15. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures
thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

16. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an
integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.
It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,
negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order

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1	may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing
2	executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.
3	17. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that
4	the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:
5	<u>ORDER</u>
6	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent LP1's Permit No. PHY 53692; Respondent
7	LP2's Permit No. PHY 48754; Respondent Rodefshalom's Pharmacist License No. RPH 55990;
8	and Respondent Kohan-Bash's Pharmacist License No. RPH 44499 are surrendered and accepted
9	by the Board of Pharmacy.
10	1. The surrender of Respondents LP1's Permit No. PHY 53692; Respondent LP2's
11	Permit No. PHY 458754; Respondent Rodefshalom's Pharmacist License No. RPH 55990; and
12	Respondent Kohan-Bash's Pharmacist License No. RPH 44499 and the acceptance of the
13	surrendered permits and license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against
14	Respondents. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of
15	Respondents' license history with the Board.
16	2. Respondent LP1 shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy in California as of
17	the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
18	3. Respondent LP2 shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy in California as of
19	the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
20	4. Respondent Rodefshalom shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacist in
21	California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
22	5. Respondent Kohan-Bash shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacist in
23	California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.
24	6. Respondents shall cause to be delivered to the Board their pocket licenses and, if one
25	was issued, its wall certificate(s) on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.
26	7. If Respondents ever file an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in
27	the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondents
28	must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the
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	Stipulated Surrender of License (Case No. 7082)

1	application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No.
2	7082 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondents when the Board determines
3	whether to grant or deny the application(s) or petition(s).
4	8. Respondents shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
5	amount of \$2,017.50 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.
6	9. If Respondents should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
7	petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
8	California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 7082 shall be deemed
9	to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondents for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any
10	other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.
11	10. Respondents may not apply, reapply, or petition for any licensure or registration of
12	the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of the Decision and Order.

7	10, 2018, Joseph Kohan (Respondent Kohan) designated as Chief Financial Officer and 25%
8	shareholder from November 14, 2007 to August 10, 2018, and Mehran Kohan-Bash (Respondent
9	Kohan-Bash) designated as Secretary and 25 % shareholder from June 24, 2015 to August 10,
10	2018. The Permit expired on August 10, 2018, and has not been renewed.

27	6. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following
28	laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

	(EMERSON PHARMACY, INC. DBA LOYOLA PHARMACY; ET. AL.) ACCUSATION

1	7. Section 4300 provides, in pertinent part, that every license issued by the Board is
2	subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.
3	8. Section 4300.1 states:
4	The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license
5 6	by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render
7	a decision suspending or revoking the license.
8	STATUTORY PROVISIONS
9	9. Section 490 provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or revoke a license
10	on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the
11	qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued.
12	10. Section 4301 states, in pertinent part:
12	The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional
14	conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:
15	
16	(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.
17 18	(g) Knowingly making or signing any certificate or other document that falsely represents the existence or nonexistence of a state of facts.
19	
20	(1) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications,
21	functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. The record of conviction of a violation of Chapter 13 (commencing with Section 801) of Title 21 of the United
22	States Code regulating controlled substances or of a violation of the statutes of this state regulating controlled substances or dangerous drugs shall be conclusive
23	evidence of unprofessional conduct. In all other cases, the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction occurred. The board may
24	inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, in order to fix the degree of discipline or, in the case of a conviction not involving controlled
25	substances or dangerous drugs, to determine if the conviction is of an offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this
26	chapter. A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this provision. The
27	board may take action when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under
28	Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of

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1	guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information, or indictment.
2	11. Section 4302 states:
3	The board may deny, suspend, or revoke any license of a corporation where
4	conditions exist in relation to any person holding 10 percent or more of the corporate stock of the corporation, or where conditions exist in relation to any officer or
5	director of the corporation that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action against a licensee.
6	12. Section 4307 states, in pertinent part:
7	(a) Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been
8	revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officient director, approximate an environment or control
9	officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on
10	probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had
11	knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving
12	as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with management or control of a licensee as follows:
13	(1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed
14	on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.
15	(2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until
16	the license is issued or reinstated.
17	REGULATORY PROVISIONS
18	13. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:
19	For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and
20	Professions Code, a crime or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of a licensee or registrant if to a substantial degree
21	it evidences present or potential unfitness of a licensee or registrant to perform the functions authorized by his license or registration in a manner consistent with the
22	public health, safety, or welfare.
23	COST RECOVERY
24	14. Section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative
25	law judge to direct a licentiate found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing
26	act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the
27	case.

	(EMERSON PHARMACY, INC. DBA LOYOLA PHARMACY; ET. AL.) ACCUSATION

1	FACTUAL BACKGROUND			
2	15. On or about December 7, 2020, after pleading guilty, Respondent Rodefshalom and			
3	Respondent Kohan-Bash were convicted of three felony counts, Count 1, violating Title 18,			
4	United States Code section 371 [conspiracy], Count 2, violating Title 18, United States Code			
5	section 1349 [fraud conspiracy], and Count 3, violating Title 18, United States Code section 1347			
6	[health care fraud] in the criminal proceeding entitled United States of America v. Rodefshalom,			
7	et al. (U.S. Dist. Ct. W.D. Pa., 2020, No. 1:20-CR-0009). On or about December 8, 2020 in the			
8	same criminal proceeding Respondent Kohan pled guilty to three felony counts, Count 1 through			
9	Count 3, and Respondent LP1 and Respondent LP2 pled guilty to two felony counts, Count 1 and			
10	Count 2. As part of the plea agreement, all defendants agreed to pay \$54,500,000 in restitution			
11	and voluntarily forfeit \$48,284,978.20.			
12	16. The circumstances underlying the conviction are that between September 2013			
13	through May 2018, Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohanbash, and Respondent Kohan			
14	conspired with others, including Respondents LP1 and Respondent LP2, to engage in a healthcare			
15	fraud scheme that involved targeting bariatric surgical patients with misleading advertisements			
16	for nutritional shakes. Specifically, online advertisements and the pharmacy's website falsely			
17	claimed that nutritional shakes would be covered by the patient's health insurance. In addition to			
18	the nutritional shakes, the patients were convinced by the pharmacies to solicit their physicians			
19	for medications that were both expensive and medically unnecessary. These additional			
20	medications were either compounded or manufactured by other pharmacies that were under the			
21	management and control of Respondents Rodefshalom, Kohanbash, and Kohan. They also			
22	purchased generic prescription drugs and over-the counter products and relabeled them so their			
23	pharmacies could appear to be the original manufacturer, which enabled them to charge higher			
24	prices for medications that would otherwise have been less expensive. In furtherance of the fraud			
25	scheme, the pharmacies used prepaid debit cards to charge fictitious transactions at the same			
26	dollar amount of the copay to falsely represent that copays were actually being collected when in			
27	fact they were not. Both private insurances			
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1	carries and government-run health programs were defrauded when reimbursement claims for			
2	these medications were submitted.			
3	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
4	(Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime)			
5	17. Respondent LP1, Respondent LP2, Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-			
6	Bash, and Respondent Kohan are subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subdivision (1)			
7	and 4302, in conjunction with California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, on the			
8	grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondents committed a substantially related crime.			
9	Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in			
10	paragraphs 15 and 16, as though set forth fully herein.			
11	SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
12	(Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)			
13	18. Respondent LP1, Respondent LP2, Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-			
14	Bash, and Respondent Kohan are subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, subsection (f),			
15	in that Respondents committed acts of dishonesty, fraud, or deceit by knowingly and willfully			
16	executing and attempting to execute a scheme to defraud a healthcare benefit program.			
17	Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in			
18	paragraphs 15 and 16, as though set forth fully herein.			
19	THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE			
20	(Knowingly Made or Signed Any Documents That			
21	Falsely Represent the Existence or Nonexistence of a State Of Facts)			
22	19. Respondent LP1, Respondent LP2, Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-			
23	Bash, and Respondent Kohan are subject to disciplinary action under section 4301, in that			
24	Respondents knowingly made and signed documents that falsely represented the existence or			
25	nonexistence of a state of facts. Complainant refers to and by this reference incorporates the			
26	allegations set forth above in paragraphs 15 and 16, as though set forth fully herein.			
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1	DISCIPLINE CONSIDERATIONS			
2	20. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, Complainant alleges that on or about			
3	July 28, 2010, in a prior disciplinary action titled In the Matter of the Accusation Against			
4	Emerson Pharmacy Inc., dba Emerson Pharmacy, Nima Rodefshalom, President, Pharmacist-In-			
5	Charge, Mehran Kohan-Bash, Secretary, Joseph Kohan, Treasurer, Chief Financial Officer,			
6	before the Board of Pharmacy, in Case Number 3330. Respondent's licenses were revoked and			
7	stayed. Respondent Emerson Pharmacy Inc., Permit No. 48754 was placed on probation for a			
8	period of three years and Respondent Rodefshalom was placed on probation for a period two			
9	years, with terms and conditions. That decision is now final.			
10	OTHER MATTERS			
11	21. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number			
12	PHY 53692, issued to Respondent LP1, Respondent LP1 shall be prohibited from serving as a			
13	manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for			
14	five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 53692 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy			
15	Permit Number PHY 53692 is reinstated if it is revoked.			
16	22. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number			
17	PHY 53692, issued to Respondent LP1, while Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-			
18	Bash, and/or Respondent Kohan have been an officer, director, and/or owner and had knowledge			
19	of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the licensee was disciplined, while			
20	Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-Bash, and/or Respondent Kohan shall be			
21	prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate,			
22	or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 53692 is placed on			
23	probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 53692 is reinstated if it is revoked.			
24	23. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number			
25	PHY 48754, issued to Respondent LP2, Respondent LP2 shall be prohibited from serving as a			
26	manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for			
27	five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 48754 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy			
28	Permit Number PHY 48754 is reinstated if it is revoked.			
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1	24. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number				
2	PHY 48754, issued to Respondent LP2, while Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-				
3	Bash, and/or Respondent Kohan have been an officer, director, and/or owner and had knowledge				
4	of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the licensee was disciplined, while				
5	Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-Bash, and/or Respondent Kohan shall be				
6	prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate,				
7	or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 48754 is placed on				
8	probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 48754 is reinstated if it is revoked.				
9	25. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacist License				
10	Number RPH 55990, issued to Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Rodefshalom shall be				
11	prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate,				
12	or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacist License Number RPH 55990 is placed on				
13	probation or until Pharmacy License Number RPH 55990 is reinstated if it is revoked.				
14	26. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacist License				
15	Number RPH 44499, issued to Respondent Kohan-Bash, Respondent Kohan-Bash shall be				
16	prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate,				
17	or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacist License Number RPH 44499 is placed on				
18	probation or until Pharmacy License Number RPH 44499 is reinstated if it is revoked.

20	WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged,				
21	and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

27	Rodefshalom;

Prohibiting Respondent Rodefshalom, Respondent Kohan-Bash, and/or Respondent 15 Kohan from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or 16 partner of a licensee for five years if Permit Number PHY 48754 is placed on probation or until 17 Permit Number PHY 48754 is reinstated if it is revoked; 18

9. Prohibiting Nima Rodefshalom from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, 19 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacist License 20 Number RPH 55990 is placed on probation or until Pharmacist License Number RPH 55990 is 21 reinstated if it is revoked; 22

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10. Prohibiting Mehran Kohan-Bash from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, 24 member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacist License Number RPH 44499 is placed on probation or until Pharmacist License Number RPH 44499 is 25 reinstated if it is revoked, 26

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1	11. Ordering Loyola Pharmacy, Loyola Pharmacy, Nima Rodefshalom Joseph Kohan,			
2	and Mehran Kohan-Bash to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation			
3	and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,			
4	12. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
