25	1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) is the	Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy		
26	(Board). She brought this action solely in her off	icial capacity and is represented in this matter by		
27	Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of Calif	fornia, by Marissa N. Hamilton, Deputy

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2. Respondent Garfield Beach CVS, LLC, dba CVS Pharmacy #8837 is represented in this proceeding by attorney Jeff J. Astarabadi, Much Shelist, P.C., whose address is: 660 Newport Center Drive, Suite 900, Newport Beach, CA 92660.

JURISDICTION

- 3. On or about September 18, 2006, the Board issued Pharmacy Permit No. PHY 47906 to Garfield Beach CVS, LLC, dba CVS Pharmacy #8837 (Respondent CVS Pharmacy). The Pharmacy Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in Accusation No. 7087 and will expire on June 1, 2023, unless renewed.
- 4. Accusation No. 7087 was filed before the Board and is currently pending against Respondent CVS Pharmacy. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served on Respondent CVS Pharmacy on October 5, 2022. Respondent CVS Pharmacy timely filed its Notice of Defense contesting the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 7087 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated herein by reference.

ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS

- 5. Respondent CVS Pharmacy has carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7087. Respondent CVS Pharmacy has also carefully read, fully discussed with counsel, and understands the effects of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval.
- 6. Respondent CVS Pharmacy is fully aware of its legal rights in this matter, including the right to a hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel at its own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against them; the right to present evidence and to testify on its own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.
- 7. Respondent CVS Pharmacy voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and every right set forth above.

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CULPABILITY

- 8. Respondent CVS Pharmacy admits the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation No. 7087.
- 9. Respondent CVS Pharmacy agrees that its Pharmacy Permit is subject to discipline and they agree to be bound by the Disciplinary Order below.

CONTINGENCY

- 10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board of Pharmacy. Respondent CVS Pharmacy understands and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board of Pharmacy may communicate directly with the Board regarding this stipulation and settlement, without notice to or participation by Respondent CVS Pharmacy or its counsel. By signing the stipulation, Respondent CVS Pharmacy understands and agrees that they may not withdraw its agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval shall be of no force or effect, except for this paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.
- 11. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile copies of this Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval, including PDF and facsimile signatures thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.
- 12. This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Settlement and Disciplinary Order for Public Reproval may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

25	PARTIES 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity		
26	as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy, Department of Consumer Affairs.		
27	2. On or about September 18, 2006, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacy Permit		
28	Number PHY 47906 to Garfield Beach CVS, LLC, dba CVS Pharmacy #8837 (Respondent CVS)

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, any of the following:

. . .

(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

. . .

10. Section 4307 of the Code states:

- (a) Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with management or control of a licensee as follows:
- (1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.
- (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated.
- (b) "Manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control of a license" as used in this section and Section 4308, may refer to a pharmacist or to any other person who serves in such capacity in or for a licensee.
- (c) The provisions of subdivision (a) may be alleged in any pleading filed pursuant to Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code. However, no order may be issued in that case except as to a person who is named in the caption, as to whom the pleading alleges the applicability of this section, and where the person has been given notice of the proceeding as required by Chapter 5 (commencing with Section 11500) of Part 1 of Division 3 of the Government Code. The authority to proceed as provided by this subdivision shall be in addition to the board's authority to proceed under Section 4339 or any other provision of law.

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two weeks E.P. ingested the wrong medication. On or about March 24, 2016, E.P. presented to

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the Providence Little Company of Mary Medical Center Emergency Room, located in Torrance, California, and was admitted with a severe intracranial bleed (brain hemorrhage) caused by Coumadin toxicity, which left E.P. with permanent neurological deficits.

17. Respondents admitted that they dispensed the wrong medication to E.P.

CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

18. Respondent CVS Pharmacy and Respondent Jeong are subject to disciplinary action under Code section 4301, subdivision (o), in conjunction with Code section 4113, subdivision (c), and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1716, in that on or about March 10, 2016, Respondents incorrectly filled E.P.'s prescription calling for Cardura 6mg, a blood pressure medication, with Coumadin 6mg, a blood thinning medication. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth in above paragraphs 15-17, as though set forth in full herein.

DISCIPLINARY CONSIDERATIONS

- 19. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent CVS Pharmacy, Complainant alleges that on or about August 18, 2021, in a prior action, the Board issued Respondent CVS Pharmacy Citation Number CI 2019 88271. That citation is now final.
- 20. To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent CVS Pharmacy, Complainant alleges that on or about September 7, 2017, in a prior action, the Board issued Respondent CVS Pharmacy Citation Number CI 2016 73975. That citation is now final.
- To determine the degree of discipline, if any, to be imposed on Respondent Jeong, 21. Complainant alleges that on or about September 7, 2017, in a prior action, the Board issued Respondent Jeong Citation Number CI 2017 76389. That citation is now final.

OTHER MATTERS

22. Pursuant to Code section 4307, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 47906, issued to Garfield Beach CVS, LLC, dba CVS Pharmacy #8837, Respondent CVS Pharmacy shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 47906 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Permit Number PHY 47906 is reinstated if it is revoked.
