7	Accusation. A copy of Accusation Number 7291 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by

9	ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS		
10	5. Respondent has carefully read and understands the charges and allegations in		
11	Accusation Number 7291. Respondent also has carefully read and understands the effects of this		
12	Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.		
13	6. Respondent is fully aware of her legal rights in this matter, including the right to a		
14	hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at		
15	her own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against her; the right to		
16	present evidence and to testify on her own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to		
17	compel the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration		
18	and court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California		
19	Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.		
20	7. Respondent voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waives and gives up each and

25	Technician License Number TCH 81839 for the Board's formal acceptance.		
26	9. Respondent understands that by signing this stipulation she enables the Board to issue		
27	an order accepting the surrender of her Pharmacy Technician License without further process.

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1	<u>CONTINGENCY</u>		
2	10. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondent understands		
3	and agrees that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly		
4	with the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by		
5	Respondent. By signing the stipulation, Respondent understands and agrees that she may not		
6	withdraw her agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers		
7	and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the		
8	Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this		
9	paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not		
10	be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.		
11	11. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile		
12	copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures		
13	thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.		
14	12. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an		
15	integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement.		
16	It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions,		
17	negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order		
18	may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing		
19	executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.		
20	13. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that		
21	the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:		
22	<u>ORDER</u>		
23	IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician License Number TCH 81839, issued		
24	to Respondent Nisha D. Lal, is surrendered and accepted by the Board.		
25	1. The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician License and the acceptance of		
26	the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against		
27	Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of		
28	Respondent's license history with the Board. Respondent understands and acknowledges that for

Respondent must comply 8 9 with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation Number 7291 shall 10 be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to 11 grant or deny the application or petition. 12

5. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the 13 amount of \$7,505.25 prior to the filing of a new or reinstated license. 14

6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or 15 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of 16 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation Number 7291 shall be 17 deemed to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondent for the purpose of any Statement of 18 Issues or any other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure. 19

28	Business and Professions Code (Code) unless otherwise indicated.

1	4. Code Section 118, subdivision (b), provides that the suspension, expiration, surrender		
2	or cancellation of a license shall not deprive the Board of jurisdiction to proceed with a		
3	disciplinary action during the period within which the license may be renewed, restored, reissued		
4	or reinstated.		
5	5. Section 4300 of the Code states, in pertinent part:		
6	(a) Every license issued may be suspended or revoked.		
7 8	(b) The board shall discipline the holder of any license issued by the board, whose default has been entered or whose case has been heard by the board and found guilty, by any of the following methods:		
9	(1) Suspending judgment.		
10	(2) Placing him or her upon probation.		
11	(3) Suspending his or her right to practice for a period not exceeding one year.		
12	(4) Revoking his or her license.

3	8. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the		
4	administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of		
5	the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and		
6	enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being		
7	renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be		
8	included in a stipulated settlement.		
9	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE		
10	(Unprofessional Conduct – Dangerous Use of Alcoholic Beverages: Reporting to Work		
11	Under the Influence on September 24, 2021)		
12	9. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action on the grounds of unprofessional conduct		
13	as defined in Code section 4301, subdivision (h), in that on or about September 24, 2021,		
14	Respondent used alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious		
15	to oneself, any other person, or to the public. The underlying circumstances are as follows.		
16	10. At the relevant time, Respondent was employed as a pharmacy clerk by Kaiser		
17	Permanente Outpatient Pharmacy, in Rancho Cordova. On or about September 24, 2021,		
18	Respondent failed to report to work at her scheduled time of 9:00 a.m. This prompted		
19	Respondent's supervisor to telephone Respondent at approximately 9:30 a.m. Respondent		
20	answered the call and explained that she had fallen asleep in her vehicle in the parking lot.		
21	Respondent appeared for duty shortly thereafter and the odor of alcoholic beverages was detected		
22	on her person. This prompted Kaiser Pharmacy staff to engage in their reasonable suspicion		
23	protocol which included, among other things, the administering of breathalyzer testing to		
24	Respondent. Those tests were administered at 11:00 a.m. and 11:18 a.m., and recorded		
25	Respondent's blood alcohol content as being .205% and .164%, respectively. Respondent was		
26	sent home and placed on administrative leave as a result of this incident. Respondent		
27	subsequently sought treatment through her employer and was placed on a "last chance"		
28	employment agreement.		

SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Unprofessional Conduct – Dangerous Use of Alcoholic Beverages: September 24, 2021 Arrest for DUI)

11. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action on the grounds of unprofessional conduct as defined in Code section 4301, subdivision (h), in that on or about September 24, 2021, Respondent used alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to herself, other persons, and/or to the public. The underlying circumstances are as follows.

On or about September 24, 2021, at about 1825 hours, officers with the California 12. Highway Patrol responded to a report of a vehicle collision in the vicinity of Vineyard Road and 9 W. Savona Drive in Sacramento County. Upon arrival at the scene, the officers observed two 10 vehicles with major damage. When an officer asked who the driver of the silver Toyota Rav4 11 was, Respondent identified herself as being the driver. At the time, Respondent was sitting on the 12 sidewalk and struggling to not fall backwards. While talking with Respondent regarding the 13 14 collision, an officer requested Respondent to stand up and walk towards the patrol vehicle. Respondent required the officer's assistance to stand up and struggled to walk in a straight line. 15 Further, the officer observed that Respondent's eyes were red and watery, her speech was 16 severely slurred, and that Respondent struggled to maintain balance. The strong odor of alcoholic 17 beverage was also detected on Respondent's person. Thereafter, field sobriety testing was 18 administered, and Respondent failed all testing. Respondent refused P.A.S. breathalyzer testing. 19 Nevertheless, Respondent was arrested for driving under the influence of alcohol due to her 20 obvious signs of intoxication. Further, the investigating offers determined that Respondent had 21 caused the collision by driving in an unsafe manner while under the influence of alcohol. 22 Subsequent blood testing showed Respondent's blood alcohol content to be 0.18%.¹ 23
