2	1.	Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Krystal Lee Wright has
3	subjected	her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 155285 to discipline.
4	2.	The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.
5	3.	The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician
6	Registrati	on based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported
7	by the evi	dence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case:
8	a.	Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301,
9		subdivision (f), for unprofessional conduct, in that while employed and on duty as a
10		pharmacy technician, Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude,
11		dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, as follows: During the period from
12		November 2021 to March 15, 2022, Respondent stole or diverted from the pharmacy
13		during business hours: Adderall, Adderall XR, Suboxone, and Norco, on
14		approximately ten different occasions, and estimated the total amount to be 80 dosage
15		units, for her own personal use and/or for her then-boyfriend's use, without the
16		pharmacy's knowledge or consent, in violation of Health and Safety Code section
17		11173.
18	b.	Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301,
19		subdivision (i), for unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent knowingly furnished,
20		gave away or administered to her then-boyfriend, a heroin addict, the controlled

14	14. From November 2021 through March 23, 2022, Respondent was working as a	
15	pharmacy technician at the Rite Aid Store (Store), located at 3101 Green Valley Road, in	
16	Cameron Park, California.	
17	15. On or about February 17, 2022, T.Y., the Pharmacist-in-Charge (PIC) at the Store's	
18	pharmacy noticed a loss of physical "on-hand" quantities of Adderall and Adderall XR capsules	
19	compared to the quantities listed in the pharmacy's computer. The PIC reported the losses to Rite	
20	Aid's corporate loss prevention department, and an investigation was launched.	
21	16. During the period from February 17, 2022, through March 12, 2022, the PIC received	
22	notifications from patients regarding shortages in their prescription vials that had been previously	
23	dispensed by the pharmacy.	
24	17. The Pharmacy Asset Protection Leader (RAPL) reviewed the closed captioned TV	
25	video, and noted that on March 11, 2022, at 12:14 p.m., Respondent was seen selecting a Monaco	
26	bag, removing a vial from the bag, then returning the bag to the "Will Call" section of the	
27	pharmacy.

1	18. On March 16, 2022, during an investigative interview about the drug losses,
2	Respondent admitted diverting Adderall, Adderall XR, Suboxone, and Norco, on approximately
3	ten different occasions, and estimated the total amount to be 80 dosage units. Respondent also
4	admitted to stealing multiple drinks, snacks, and cosmetics merchandise from the Store on
5	multiple occasions. Respondent also submitted a written statement, admitting that on March 11,
6	2022, and again on March 15, 2022, she stole 8 tablets each of Norco 10/325 and Adderall XR
7	from the "Will Call" area of the pharmacy. She also admitted that in the four months prior to
8	March 2022, she had stolen 80 units of controlled substances, including 3 Suboxone tablets and 6-
9	7 Suboxone films. She explained that the diverted drugs had been for her then-boyfriend who had
10	relapsed on heroin, and had not been for her personal use. She stated that she had known that
11	what she was doing was wrong, but she had wanted to help her then-boyfriend avoid an overdose.
12	Respondent was subsequently terminated from her job at the pharmacy.
13	19. On April 4, 2022, the Board received an amended DEA 106 drug loss report from the
14	pharmacy that listed the same types of drugs that Respondent had admitted to diverting.
15	20. On May 2, 2022, Respondent's CURES Patient Activity Report showed a history of
16	opioids medications usage, including hydrocodone/APAP 5/325mg and tramadol 50mg from July
17	to October 2020.
18	FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE
19	(Acts Involving Moral Turpitude, Dishonesty, Fraud, Deceit, or Corruption)
20	21. Respondent is subject to disciplinary action pursuant to Code section 4301,
21	subdivision (f), for unprofessional conduct, in that while employed and on duty as a pharmacy
22	technician, Respondent committed acts involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or
23	corruption, as follows: During the period from November 2021 to March 15, 2022, Respondent
24	stole or diverted from the pharmacy during business hours: Adderall, Adderall XR, Suboxone,
