pursuant to Business and Professions Code sections 118(b) and 4300.1, does not deprive the Board of its authority to institute or continue this disciplinary proceeding.

- 3. On or about June 7, 2023, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class Mail copies of the Accusation No. 7509, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is: 25259 Dewolfe Rd., Newhall, CA 91321.
- 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505(c) and/or Business and Professions Code section 124.
 - 5. Government Code section 11506(c) states, in pertinent part:
 - (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. Failure to file a notice of defense . . . shall constitute a waiver of respondent's right to a hearing, but the agency in its discretion may nevertheless grant a hearing.
- 6. The Board takes official notice of its records and the fact that Respondent failed to file a Notice of Defense within 15 days after service upon her of the Accusation, and therefore waived her right to a hearing on the merits of Accusation No. 7509.
 - 7. California Government Code section 11520(a) states, in pertinent part:
 - (a) If the respondent either fails to file a notice of defense . . . or to appear at the hearing, the agency may take action based upon the respondent's express admissions or upon other evidence and affidavits may be used as evidence without any notice to respondent
- 8. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this matter, finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7509, are separately and severally, found to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.
- 9. The Board finds that the actual costs for Investigation and Enforcement are \$5,756.50, as of July 5, 2023.

DETERMINATION OF ISSUES 1 1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Veronique Mary Ashby has 2 subjected her Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 99451 to discipline. 3 2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default. 4 3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Pharmacy Technician 5 Registration based upon the following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported 6 7 by the evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case: Business and Professions Code section 4301, subdivision (h) – Dangerous Use of 8 a. 9 Alcohol; and b. Business and Professions Code section 4301 – Unprofessional Conduct. 10 **ORDER** 11 IT IS SO ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 99451, issued to 12 Respondent Veronique Mary Ashby, is revoked. 13 14 Pursuant to Government Code section 11520, subdivision (c), Respondent may serve a written motion requesting that the Decision be vacated and stating the grounds relied on within 15 seven (7) days after service of the Decision on Respondent. 25	Technician Registration was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought		
26	herein and will expire on May 31, 2023, unless renewed.		
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JURISDICTION 1 2 3. This Accusation is brought before the Board of Pharmacy (Board), under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code 3 (Code) unless otherwise indicated. 4 4. Section 4011 of the Code provides that the Board shall administer and enforce both 5 the Pharmacy Law [Bus. & Prof. Code, § 4000 et seq.] and the Uniform Controlled Substances 6 7 Act [Health & Safety Code, § 11000 et seq.]. 5. Section 4300, subdivision (a) of the Code provides that every license issued by the 8 9 Board may be suspended or revoked. 6. Section 4300.1 of the Code states: 10 11 The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the 12 placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any 13 investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license. 14 STATUTORY PROVISIONS 15 Section 477 of the Code states, in part: "As used in this division: . . . (b) "License" 7. 16 includes certificate, registration or other means to engage in a business or profession regulated by 17 this code." 18 8. Section 4301 of the Code states, in pertinent part: 19 The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of 20 unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct includes, but is not limited to, any of the following: 21 22 (h) The administering to oneself, of any controlled substance, or the use of any 23 dangerous drug or of alcoholic beverages to the extent or in a manner as to be dangerous or injurious to oneself, to a person holding a license under this chapter, or 24 to any other person or to the public, or to the extent that the use impairs the ability of the person to conduct with safety to the public the practice authorized by the license. 25 26 27 28

- 9. Section 4307, subdivision (a), of the Code states:
- (a) Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with management or control of a licensee as follows:
- (1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.
- (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated.

COST RECOVERY

10. Section 125.3 of the Code provides, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case, with failure of the licensee to comply subjecting the license to not being renewed or reinstated. If a case settles, recovery of investigation and enforcement costs may be included in a stipulated settlement.

FACTUAL ALLEGATIONS

- 11. At all times relevant herein, Respondent was employed as an inpatient pharmacy technician at Olive View Medical Center located in Sylmar, California, on contract through staffing agency Rx Relief.
- 12. On or about November 4, 2022, Respondent was observed entering the outpatient pharmacy. Immediately thereafter, an empty pocket-sized bottle of whiskey was found on the floor near Respondent. When the pharmacist-in-charge of the outpatient pharmacy approached Respondent and asked if the whiskey bottle belonged to Respondent, Respondent initially denied it, but then responded "Maybe. Can I have it back?" Respondent's behavior exhibited signs that

Ordering Veronique Mary Ashby to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs 6 7 of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; 8 3. 9 Prohibiting Veronique Mary Ashby from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for five years if Pharmacy Technician 10 Registration Number TCH 99451 is placed on probation or until Pharmacy Technician 11 Registration Number TCH 99451 is reinstated, if Pharmacy Technician Registration Number 12 TCH 99451 is revoked; and 13 4.
