IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Pharmacy Technician Registration No. TCH 185266, issued to Respondent Christopher Owen Townsend, is surrendered and accepted by the Board.

The surrender of Respondent's Pharmacy Technician Registration and the acceptance
 of the surrendered license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against
 Respondent. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of
 Respondent/s license history with the Board.

Respondent shall lose all rights and privileges as a Pharmacy Technician in California
 as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3. Respondent shall cause to be delivered to the Board his pocket license and, if one was
issued, his wall certificate on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

4. If Respondent ever applies for licensure or petitions for reinstatement in the State of
California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondent must comply
with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or
petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation No. 7523 shall be
deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondent when the Board determines whether to
grant or deny the application or petition.

20 5. Respondent shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
21 amount of \$3,816.17 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

6. If Respondent should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 7523 shall be deemed
