24 IT IS HEREBY STIPULATED AND AGREED by and between the parties to the above-
25 entitled proceedings that the following matters are true:

26 **PARTIES**

27 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) is the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy
28 (Board). She brought this action solely in her official capacity and is represented in this matter by

1 Rob Bonta, Attorney General of the State of California, by Thomas L. Rinaldi, Supervising
2 Deputy Attorney General.

3 2. Mansour Partners, Inc. dba Best Buy Drugs, Yousef Mansour, Paul Mansour
4 (Respondent Best Buy Drugs) is representing itself in this proceeding and has chosen not to
5 exercise its right to be represented by counsel.

6 3. Paul Mansour (Respondent Mansour) is representing himself in this proceeding and
7 has chosen not to exercise his right to be represented by counsel.

8 4. On or about February 24, 2017, the Board issued Permit No. PHY 55583 to
9 Respondent Best Buy Drugs, with Yousef Mansour designated as the Chief Executive Officer,
10 President, and 50% shareholder since February 24, 2017, and Paul Mansour designated as
11 President, 50% shareholder, Secretary, and Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer since February 24,
12 2017. The Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought in
13 Accusation No. 7573 and will expire on February 1, 2024, unless renewed.

14 5. On or about August 5, 1991, the Board issued Pharmacist License Number RPH
15 44325 to Respondent Mansour. The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times
16 relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on December 31, 2024, unless renewed

17 **JURISDICTION**

18 6. Accusation No. 7573 was filed before the Board, and is currently pending against
19 Respondents. The Accusation and all other statutorily required documents were properly served
20 on Respondents on September 14, 2023. Respondents timely filed a Notice of Defense contesting
21 the Accusation. A copy of Accusation No. 7573 is attached as Exhibit A and incorporated by
22 reference.

23 **ADVISEMENT AND WAIVERS**

24 7. Respondents have carefully read, and understands the charges and allegations in
25 Accusation No. 7573. Respondents also have carefully read, and understands the effects of this
26 Stipulated Surrender of License and Order.

27 8. Respondent is fully aware of its legal rights in this matter, including the right to a
28 hearing on the charges and allegations in the Accusation; the right to be represented by counsel, at

1 its own expense; the right to confront and cross-examine the witnesses against them; the right to
2 present evidence and to testify on its own behalf; the right to the issuance of subpoenas to compel
3 the attendance of witnesses and the production of documents; the right to reconsideration and
4 court review of an adverse decision; and all other rights accorded by the California
5 Administrative Procedure Act and other applicable laws.

6 9. Respondents voluntarily, knowingly, and intelligently waive and give up each and
7 every right set forth above.

8 **CULPABILITY**

9 10. Respondents admit the truth of each and every charge and allegation in Accusation
10 No. 7573, agree that cause exists for discipline and hereby surrenders their Permit No. PHY
11 55583 and Pharmacist License No. RPH 44325 for the Board's formal acceptance.

12 11. Respondents understand that by signing this stipulation they enable the Board to issue
13 an order accepting the surrender of Permit No. PHY 55583 and Pharmacist License No. RPH
14 44325 without further process.

15 **CONTINGENCY**

16 12. This stipulation shall be subject to approval by the Board. Respondents understand
17 and agree that counsel for Complainant and the staff of the Board may communicate directly with
18 the Board regarding this stipulation and surrender, without notice to or participation by
19 Respondents. By signing the stipulation, Respondents understand and agree that they may not
20 withdraw their agreement or seek to rescind the stipulation prior to the time the Board considers
21 and acts upon it. If the Board fails to adopt this stipulation as its Decision and Order, the
22 Stipulated Surrender and Disciplinary Order shall be of no force or effect, except for this
23 paragraph, it shall be inadmissible in any legal action between the parties, and the Board shall not
24 be disqualified from further action by having considered this matter.

25 13. The parties understand and agree that Portable Document Format (PDF) and facsimile
26 copies of this Stipulated Surrender of License and Order, including PDF and facsimile signatures
27 thereto, shall have the same force and effect as the originals.

28 ///

14. This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order is intended by the parties to be an integrated writing representing the complete, final, and exclusive embodiment of their agreement. It supersedes any and all prior or contemporaneous agreements, understandings, discussions, negotiations, and commitments (written or oral). This Stipulated Surrender of License and Order may not be altered, amended, modified, supplemented, or otherwise changed except by a writing executed by an authorized representative of each of the parties.

15. In consideration of the foregoing admissions and stipulations, the parties agree that the Board may, without further notice or formal proceeding, issue and enter the following Order:

ORDER

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that Respondent Best Buy Drugs' Permit No. PHY 55583 and Respondent Mansour's Pharmacist License No. RPH 44325 are surrendered and accepted by the Board.

1. The surrender of Respondent Best Buy Drugs' Permit No. PHY 55583 and Respondent Mansour's Pharmacist License No. RPH 44325 and the acceptance of the surrendered permit and license by the Board shall constitute the imposition of discipline against Respondents. This stipulation constitutes a record of the discipline and shall become a part of Respondents' license history with the Board. Respondents understand and agree that for purposes of Business and Professions Code section 4307, this surrender shall be construed the same as revocation.

2. Respondent Best Buy Drugs shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacy in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

3. Respondent Mansour shall lose all rights and privileges as a pharmacist in California as of the effective date of the Board's Decision and Order.

4. Respondents shall cause to be delivered to the Board any pocket licenses and, if one was issued, any wall certificates on or before the effective date of the Decision and Order.

5. If either Respondent ever files an application for licensure or a petition for reinstatement in the State of California, the Board shall treat it as a new application for licensure. Respondents must comply with all the laws, regulations and procedures for licensure in effect at the time the application or petition is filed, and all of the charges and allegations contained in

1 Accusation No. 7573 shall be deemed to be true, correct and admitted by Respondents when the
2 Board determines whether to grant or deny the application(s) or petition(s).

3 6. Respondents shall pay the agency its costs of investigation and enforcement in the
4 amount of \$1,603.75 prior to issuance of a new or reinstated license.

5 7. If Respondents should ever apply or reapply for a new license or certification, or
6 petition for reinstatement of a license, by any other health care licensing agency in the State of
7 California, all of the charges and allegations contained in Accusation, No. 7573 shall be deemed
8 to be true, correct, and admitted by Respondents for the purpose of any Statement of Issues or any
9 other proceeding seeking to deny or restrict licensure.

10 8. Respondents may not apply, reapply, or petition for any licensure or registration of
11 the Board for three (3) years from the effective date of the Decision and Order.

12 **ACCEPTANCE**

13 I have carefully read the Stipulated Surrender of License and Order. I understand the
14 stipulation and the effect it will have on my Permit (PHY 55583.) I enter into this Stipulated

23 **PARTIES**

24 1. Anne Sodergren (Complainant) brings this Accusation solely in her official capacity
25 as the Executive Officer of the Board of Pharmacy (Board), Department of Consumer Affairs.

26 2. On or about February 24, 2017, the Board of Pharmacy issued Permit Number PHY
27 55583 to Mansour Partners, Inc. dba Best Buy Drugs (Respondent Best Buy Drugs), with Yousef
28 Mansour designated as the Chief Executive Officer, President, and 50% shareholder since

February 24, 2017, and Paul Mansour designated as President, 50% shareholder, Secretary, and Treasurer/Chief Financial Officer since February 24, 2017. The Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on February 1, 2024, unless renewed.

3. On or about August 5, 1991, the Board of Pharmacy issued Pharmacist License Number RPH 44325 to Paul Mansour (Respondent Mansour). The Pharmacist License was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will expire on December 31, 2024, unless renewed.

4. This Accusation is brought before the Board under the authority of the following laws. All section references are to the Business and Professions Code unless otherwise indicated.

5. Section 4300 provides, in pertinent part, that every license issued by the Board is subject to discipline, including suspension or revocation.

6. Section 4300.1 states:

The expiration, cancellation, forfeiture, or suspension of a board-issued license by operation of law or by order or decision of the board or a court of law, the placement of a license on a retired status, or the voluntary surrender of a license by a licensee shall not deprive the board of jurisdiction to commence or proceed with any investigation of, or action or disciplinary proceeding against, the licensee or to render a decision suspending or revoking the license.

STATUTORY PROVISIONS

7. Section 490 provides, in pertinent part, that a board may suspend or revoke a license on the ground that the licensee has been convicted of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, or duties of the business or profession for which the license was issued.

8. Section 4301 states, in pertinent part:

The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of unprofessional conduct or whose license has been issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is not limited to, any of the following:

....

(f) The commission of any act involving moral turpitude, dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption, whether the act is committed in the course of relations as a licensee or otherwise, and whether the act is a felony or misdemeanor or not.

(g) Knowingly making or signing any certificate or other document that falsely

represents the existence or nonexistence of a state of facts.

....

(j) The violation of any of the statutes of this state, of any other state, or of the United States regulating controlled substances and dangerous drugs.

....

(l) The conviction of a crime substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. The record of conviction of a violation of Chapter 13 (commencing with Section 801) of Title 21 of the United States Code regulating controlled substances or of a violation of the statutes of this state regulating controlled substances or dangerous drugs shall be conclusive evidence of unprofessional conduct. In all other cases, the record of conviction shall be conclusive evidence only of the fact that the conviction occurred. The board may inquire into the circumstances surrounding the commission of the crime, in order to fix the degree of discipline or, in the case of a conviction not involving controlled substances or dangerous drugs, to determine if the conviction is of an offense substantially related to the qualifications, functions, and duties of a licensee under this chapter. A plea or verdict of guilty or a conviction following a plea of nolo contendere is deemed to be a conviction within the meaning of this provision. The board may take action when the time for appeal has elapsed, or the judgment of conviction has been affirmed on appeal or when an order granting probation is made suspending the imposition of sentence, irrespective of a subsequent order under Section 1203.4 of the Penal Code allowing the person to withdraw his or her plea of guilty and to enter a plea of not guilty, or setting aside the verdict of guilty, or dismissing the accusation, information, or indictment.

....

(o) Violating or attempting to violate, directly or indirectly, or assisting in or abetting the violation of or conspiring to violate any provision or term of this chapter or of the applicable federal and state laws and regulations governing pharmacy, including regulations established by the board or by any other state or federal regulatory agency.

9. Section 4302 states:

The board may deny, suspend, or revoke any license where conditions exist in relation to any person holding 10 percent or more of the ownership interest or where conditions exist in relation to any officer, director, or other person with management or control of the license that would constitute grounds for disciplinary action against a licensee.

10. Section 4307 states, in pertinent part:

(a) Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control of any partnership, corporation, trust, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or any other person with management or control had knowledge of or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was

denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with management or control of a licensee as follows:

(1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years.

(2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated.

11. Health and Safety Code section 11173 states:

(a) No person shall obtain or attempt to obtain controlled substances, or procure or attempt to procure the administration of or prescription for controlled substances, (1) by fraud, deceit, misrepresentation, or subterfuge; or (2) by the concealment of a material fact.

(b) No person shall make a false statement in any prescription, order, report, or record, required by this division.

(c) No person shall, for the purpose of obtaining controlled substances, falsely assume the title of, or represent himself to be, a manufacturer, wholesaler, pharmacist, physician, dentist, veterinarian, registered nurse, physician's assistant, or other authorized person.

(d) No person shall affix any false or forged label to a package or receptacle containing controlled substances.

REGULATORY PROVISIONS

12. California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, states:

(a) For the purpose of denial, suspension, or revocation of a personal or facility license pursuant to Section 141 or Division 1.5 (commencing with Section 475) of the Business and Professions Code, a crime, professional misconduct, or act shall be considered substantially related to the qualifications, functions or duties of the practice, profession, or occupation that may be performed under the license type sought or held if to a substantial degree it evidences present or potential unfitness of an applicant or licensee to perform the functions authorized by the license in a manner consistent with the public health, safety, or welfare.

(b) In making the substantial relationship determination required under subdivision (a) for a crime, the board will consider the following criteria:

(1) The nature and gravity of the offense;

(2) The number of years elapsed since the date of the offense; and

(3) The nature and duties of the practice, profession, or occupation that may be performed under the license type sought or held.

(c) For purposes of subdivision (a), substantially related crimes, professional misconduct, or acts shall include, but are not limited to, those which:

(1) Violate or attempt to violate, directly or indirectly, or to aid, abet or

conspire to violate, any provision of law of this state, or any other jurisdiction, governing the practice of pharmacy.

(2) Violate or attempt to violate, directly or indirectly, or to aid, abet or conspire to violate, any provision of Chapter 13 (commencing with Section 801) of Title 21 of the United States Code regulating controlled substances or any law of this state, or any other jurisdiction, relating to controlled substances or dangerous drugs.

(3) Violate or attempt to violate, directly or indirectly, or to aid, abet or conspire to violate, any provision of law of this state, or any other jurisdiction, relating to government provided or government supported healthcare.

(4) Involve dishonesty, fraud, deceit, or corruption related to money, items, documents, or personal information.

(5) Involve a conviction for driving under the influence of drugs or alcohol.

COST RECOVERY

13. Section 125.3 states, in pertinent part, that the Board may request the administrative law judge to direct a licensee found to have committed a violation or violations of the licensing act to pay a sum not to exceed the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of the case.

FIRST CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE

(Conviction of a Substantially Related Crime)

14. Respondents Best Buy Drugs and Mansour are subject to disciplinary action under sections 4300, and 4301, subdivisions (l) and (o), in conjunction with section 4302 and California Code of Regulations, title 16, section 1770, on the grounds of unprofessional conduct, in that Respondent Mansour committed a substantially related crime, as follows: On or about March 8, 2023, after pleading guilty, Respondent Mansour was convicted of one felony count of violating Title 18, United States Code, Section 1347 [health care fraud], in the criminal proceeding entitled *United States of America v. Paul Mansour* (U.S.C.D. Cal., 2023, No. 2:23-cr-00100). The circumstances surrounding the conviction are that between January 2017, and continuing to or around June 2022, Respondent Mansour created fake patient profiles at Best Buy Pharmacy where he was the 50% owner and pharmacist-in-charge. The fictitious patient profiles duplicated prescriptions for medications provided to real patients of the pharmacy without the patient's permission or knowledge of the prescribing physicians. Respondent Mansour then submitted false and fraudulent claims to Medicare thereby defrauding the Medicare program of somewhere

1 between \$600,000 and \$1,047,243.

2 **SECOND CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

3 **(Dishonesty, Fraud, or Deceit)**

4 15. Respondents Best Buy Drugs and Mansour are subject to disciplinary action under
5 sections 4301, subsection (f), and 4302, in that they committed acts of dishonesty, fraud, or deceit
6 by admittedly defrauding Medicare. Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates,
7 the allegations set forth above in paragraph 14, as though set forth fully herein.

8 **THIRD CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

9 **(Forged Prescriptions)**

10 16. Respondents Best Buy Drugs and Mansour are subject to disciplinary action under
11 section 4301, subdivision (g), for violating section 4324, subdivision (a) and Health and Safety
12 Code section 11173, subdivision (b), in that Respondent Mansour created false prescriptions.
13 Complainant refers to, and by this reference incorporates, the allegations set forth above in
14 paragraph 14, as though set forth fully.

15 **FOURTH CAUSE FOR DISCIPLINE**

16 **(Violation of State Statutes Regulating Controlled Substances)**

17 17. Respondents Best Buy Drugs and Mansour are subject to disciplinary action under
18 section 4301, subdivisions (j) and (o), for unprofessional conduct in that Respondents violated
19 state statutes regulating controlled substances. Complainant refers to, and by this reference
20 incorporates, the allegations set forth above in paragraph 14, as though set forth fully.

21 **OTHER MATTERS**

22 18. Pursuant to section 4307 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy License
23 number PHY 55583 issued to Mansour Partners, Inc. dba Best Buy Drugs, then Mansour
24 Partners, Inc., shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member,
25 officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for 1) a period not to exceed five (5) years if
26 Pharmacy Permit number PHY 55583 is placed on probation; or, 2) if the pharmacy permit is
27 revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the pharmacy permit is reinstated.

28 ///

19. Pursuant to section 4307 of the Code, if discipline is imposed on Pharmacy License number PHY 55583 issued to Mansour Partners, Inc. dba Best Buy Drugs, then Paul Mansour, President, shall be prohibited from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee for 1) a period not to exceed five (5) years if Pharmacy Permit number PHY 55583 is placed on probation; or, 2) if the pharmacy permit is revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the pharmacy permit is reinstated.

PRAYER

WHEREFORE, Complainant requests that a hearing be held on the matters herein alleged, and that following the hearing, the Board of Pharmacy issue a decision:

1. Revoking or suspending Permit Number PHY 55583, issued to Mansour Partners, Inc. dba Best Buy Drugs, Yousef Mansour, Paul Mansour;

2. Revoking or suspending Pharmacist License Number RPH 44325, issued to Paul Mansour;

3. Prohibiting Mansour Partners, Inc. dba Best Buy Drugs from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with management or control of any Pharmacy licensee;

4. Prohibiting Paul Mansour from serving as a manager, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, partner, or in any other position with management or control of any Pharmacy licensee;

5. Ordering Best Buy Drugs and Paul Mansour to pay the Board of Pharmacy the reasonable costs of the investigation and enforcement of this case, pursuant to Business and Professions Code section 125.3; and,

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6. Taking such other and further action as deemed necessary and proper.
