Alpesh Maneklal Patel (Respondent) and Aiken Kim Bui before the Board of Pharmacy.(Accusation attached as Exhibit A.)

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2. On or about January 25, 2017, the Board of Pharmacy issued Permit Number PHY 3 55429 to Benzer Pharmacy Holding LLC, to do business as Benzer Pharmacy, with Hema Manish 4 Patel as Chief Executive Officer and Alpesh Maneklal Patel as President. On or about June 12, 5 2020, Benzer Pharmacy Holding LLC changed its business name to Coastal Drugs LLC dba 6 Coastal Drugs (Respondent Coastal Drugs). Since January 25, 2017, Hema Manish Patel has 7 served or been listed in Board records as Chief Executive Officer of Respondent Coastal Drugs 8 9 and Alpesh Maneklal Patel has served or been listed in Board records as President of Respondent 10 Coastal Drugs. According to the Board's records, Aiken Kim Bui is and has been the Pharmacistin-Charge since March 11, 2022. However, Aiken Kim Bui was employed as the Pharmacist-in-11 Charge at Respondent Coastal Drugs' pharmacy from March 11, 2022 to January 19, 2023. The 12 Permit was in full force and effect at all times relevant to the charges brought herein and will 13 14 expire on January 1, 2024, unless renewed. 3. On or about December 22, 2023, Respondent was served by Certified and First Class 15 Mail copies of the Accusation No. 7591, Statement to Respondent, Notice of Defense, Request 16 for Discovery, and Discovery Statutes (Government Code sections 11507.5, 11507.6, and 17 11507.7) at Respondent's address of record which, pursuant to Business and Professions Code 18 19 section 4100, is required to be reported and maintained with the Board. Respondent's address of record was and is: 3500 E. Broadway, Long Beach, CA 90803. 2021 4. Service of the Accusation was effective as a matter of law under the provisions of Government Code section 11505(c) and/or Business and Professions Code section 124. 22 5. Government Code section 11506(c) states, in pertinent part: 23 24 (c) The respondent shall be entitled to a hearing on the merits if the respondent files a notice of defense . . . and the notice shall be deemed a specific denial of all 25 parts of the accusation . . . not expressly admitted. 8	8. Pursuant to its authority under Government Code section 11520, the Board finds	
9	Respondent is in default. The Board will take action without further hearing and, based on the	
10	relevant evidence contained in the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this matter,	
11	finds that the charges and allegations in Accusation No. 7591, are separately and severally, found	
12	to be true and correct by clear and convincing evidence.	
13	9. The Board finds that the actual costs for Investigation and Enforcement are \$4,648.75

15	DETERMINATION OF ISSUES	
16	1. Based on the foregoing findings of fact, Respondent Coastal Drugs LLC dba Coastal	
17	Drugs; Hema Manish Patel, Alpesh Maneklal Patel has subjected its Permit No. PHY 55429 to	
18	discipline.	
19	2. The agency has jurisdiction to adjudicate this case by default.	
20	3. The Board of Pharmacy is authorized to revoke Respondent's Permit based upon the	
21	following violations alleged in the Accusation which are supported by the evidence contained in	
22	the Default Decision Investigatory Evidence Packet in this case:	
23	a. Business and Professions Code sections 4301, subdivision (o), and 4113 in

9. Code section 4307, subdivision (a) states:

Any person who has been denied a license or whose license has been revoked or is under suspension, or who has failed to renew his or her license while it was under suspension, or who has been a manager, administrator, owner member, officer, director, associate, or partner of any partnership, corporation, firm, or association whose application for a license has been denied or revoked, is under suspension or has been placed on probation, and while acting as the manger, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner had knowledge or knowingly participated in any conduct for which the license was denied, revoked, suspended, or placed on probation, shall be prohibited from serving as a manger, administrator, owner, member, officer, director, associate, or partner of a licensee as follows: (1) Where a probationary license is issued or where an existing license is placed on probation, this prohibition shall remain in effect for a period not to exceed five years. (2) Where the license is denied or revoked, the prohibition shall continue until the license is issued or reinstated.

## STATUTORY PROVISIONS

10. Code section 4022 states, in pertinent part:

"Dangerous drug" or "dangerous device" means any drug or device unsafe for self-use in humans or animals, and includes the following:

(a) Any drug that bears the legend: "Caution: federal law prohibits dispensing without prescription," "Rx only," or words of similar import.

(a) All records of manufacture and of sale, acquisition, receipt, shipment, or disposition of dangerous drugs or dangerous devices shall be at all times during business hours open to inspection by authorized officers of the law, and shall be preserved for at least three years from the date of making. A current inventory shall be kept by every manufacturer, wholesaler, third-party logistics provider, pharmacy, veterinary food-animal drug retailer, outsourcing facility, physician, dentist, podiatrist, veterinarian, laboratory, licensed correctional clinic, as defined in Section 4187, clinic, hospital, institution, or establishment holding a currently valid and unrevoked certificate, license, permit, registration, or exemption under Division 2 (commencing with Section 1200) of the Health and Safety Code or

3	responsible, with the pharmacist-in-charge, responsible manager, or designated
4	representative-in-charge, for maintaining the records and inventory described in this section.
5	(c) The pharmacist-in-charge, responsible manager, or designated representative-in-charge shall not be criminally responsible for acts of the owner,
6	officer, partner, or employee that violate this section and of which the pharmacist- in-charge, responsible manager, or designated representative-in-charge had no
7	knowledge, or in which he or she did not knowingly participate.
8	(d) Pharmacies that dispense nonprescription diabetes test devices pursuant to prescriptions shall retain records of acquisition and sale of those nonprescription
9	diabetes test devices for at least three years from the date of making. The records shall be at all times during business hours open to inspection by authorized officers
10	of the law.
11	12. Code section 4301 states, in pertinent part:
12	The board shall take action against any holder of a license who is guilty of
13	unprofessional conduct or whose license has been procured by fraud or misrepresentation or issued by mistake. Unprofessional conduct shall include, but is
