## Board Meeting Actions – October 25-26, 2022

The California State Board of Pharmacy took the following actions October 25-26, 2022:

- Approved minutes for Board meetings held July 27-28, 2022; August 25, 2022; September 14, 2022; and September 21, 2022.
- Received an update from the Department of Consumer Affairs.
- Received a presentation on research underway on Senate Bill 159 (Chapter 532, Statutes of 2019) related to HIV Preexposure and Postexposure Prophylaxis.
- Voted to adopt regulation text for Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 1735.2, related to Compounding Self-Assessment.
- Voted to approve proposed text for Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 1706.6, related to temporary licenses of military spouses and partners.
- Received a report summarizing work at the September 14, 2022, meeting of the Medication Error Reduction and Workforce Committee.
- Voted to pursue statutory changes to Business and Professions Code sections 4204 and 4192 as related to surgical clinics.
- Voted to initiate rulemaking related to Title 16, California Code of Regulations, sections 1750 and 1750.1, related to outsourcing facilities.
- Voted to pursue a statutory proposal to increase the fine for unlicensed activity not to exceed \$5,000 for each occurrence pursuant to a citation issued by the Board.
- Received a presentation on implementing a Drug Supply Chain Security Act interoperability network from the National Association of Boards of Pharmacy.
- Received a fee audit report prepared by Capital Accounting Partners, LLC.
- Received a report summarizing work at the October 25, 2022, meeting of the Standard of Care Committee.
- Voted to pursue a statutory proposal to amend Business and Professions Code section 4115, related to pharmacy technician duties and the pharmacist-to-pharmacy technician ratio.
- Voted to rescind prior posted text and approved regulatory text for Title 16, California Code of Regulations, section 1709.1, related to designation of pharmacist-in-charge. The Board also voted to establish an effective date that is six months following the date of approval of the amendments by the Office of Administrative Law.
- Received a report from the Organizational Development Committee.
- Voted to pursue statutory changes to amend Business and Professions Code section 4400 related to the Board's fee authorization to address the Board's financial condition.
- Received a report from the executive officer.
