a. **National Association of Boards of Pharmacy (NABP) Requests for Nominees – Accreditation Council for Pharmacy Education**

c. **Prescriptions and Patients: Addressing Challenges, Finding Opportunities, A Joint Forum on Controlled Substances and Medications for Opioid Use Disorder Access**

As previously shared, a joint forum on controlled substances and medications for opioid use disorder was held in Sacramento. *Prescriptions and Patients: Addressing Challenges, Finding Opportunities*, took place December 17, 2025, at California State University, Sacramento. The forum was hosted by the California State Board of Pharmacy who partnered with the Department of Consumer Affairs, the Medical Board of California, Osteopathic Medical Board of California, the Dental Board of California, the Physician Assistant Board, and the California Board of Registered Nursing.

Across the discussions, several key themes emerged that reflect both the complexity of the current healthcare environment and the collective commitment to improving patient outcomes.

To help guide further efforts, stakeholder feedback was solicited through a voluntary brief survey. Results of the survey will help gain a better understanding of priorities, identify areas where additional support or clarification is needed, and assess interest in future collaborative activities.

d. Mobile Inspection Program

April 1, 2026, the Board transitioned to a new mobile inspection program. Since that time, about 118 inspections have been conducted or are in progress. As with implementation of any new system, some challenges have been identified. Staff are working through new processes and technical challenges as they arise. Once fully implemented, the new system will improve data reports and should streamline inspection-related communication between licensees and the Board.
